
through the carpark.

At the moment it is one of my favourite times of the year- enrolment interviews. It's such a pleasure to meet our new students and their families. The life journey taken to reach Our Lady of Lourdes is often quite considerable, overcoming many obstacles to be rewarded with the gift of a child who can come to our school.

You may remember me asking you the question: "Why would you like Our Lady of Lourdes school for your child?" Parents always answer that they would like a school that imparts good values to their children, values that they hold themselves.

Today I'm writing about the carpark which does crossover into good values. In Australia we can be caring, polite and respectful in our regular lives but somehow when we get into a car......

We are lucky to have the carpark to use to drop off the children. Imagine how difficult and dangerous it would be if we had to drop the children off in Olive St or Grantham Road. The carpark does become congested some mornings and the peak time for our carpark does coincide with the end times of morning Mass. We arrive at the carpark after an epic morning of getting children ready for school and sometimes/always feel pressured.



- -Arrive at school between 8:10am and 8:25am. The carpark is less busy at that time
- -Park on Grantham Road and surrounding streets and walk the children to the gate.
- -Plan to arrive at the carpark no later than 8:30am so you have 10 minutes to get through the queue if you plan to use Kiss and Drop zone outside the Hall.
- -Use the Kiss and Drop as parking spaces are limited in the mornings when the carpark outside the Office is closed after 8:10am
- -Use both spots at the Kiss and Drop. There is now a big number 1 and 2 painted on the road.
 -Consider others by not getting out of your car at the Kiss and Drop zone, not double parking or parking in the Office carpark before school and using the pedestrian crossing to walk the children

Consider others and especially our children by not judging and or abusing parents or parishioners who you feel are not following the rules. This behaviour is not something you are wanting to see in your children and they will not want to see it in their parents or in the parents of their friends. Along with Mrs Cividin, Mrs Regan, Miss Bentley and Miss Schrader, one or two mornings a week I go into the carpark — it's great to meet so many of you early in the morning and I have lots of interesting conversations with children and parents that are good for the building of connections between home and school, an important part of my job. If someone is not doing the right thing I will remind them of our rules out of earshot of children. I can understand that sometimes parents will park in a place because they are thinking of their child but school is a place where the rules and guidelines apply to all regardless of circumstances and Catholic schools are about all acting together as a Christian community. So we really rely on everyone doing the right thing in front of children who are absorbing the values of their parents.



Out and About

Last week I spoke to our Year 6 students about the safety issues around social media. It is always a tricky



subject. Social media in all forms is not allowed at school (even staff cannot access Facebook via the school internet). However we at times get complaints about student's behaviour on social media. As a school it is very difficult for us to control because due to the restrictions we have in place this activity happens at home on "the parents watch", and we have no control over the home environment other than asking for parental cooperation. It is equally vexing because it actually contravenes the rules of all the social media sites for any primary age student to have such an account. To set up an account a student (or their parent) has to lie about their age. As one parent pointed out to me how can we expect our children to act on line with integrity when their membership is based on a lie. When I spoke to the students I pointed out that the reason such sites have age restrictions is because they consider children under 13 to not be mature enough to use and understand the true ramifications of information they share online. There are many instances where age restrictions are in place for the safety of our children. We would not let a 14 year old drive a car, a child of any age smoke cigarettes or consume alcohol because as adults we know that the age restrictions that apply are there to protect the young person until they are able to make a responsible decision themselves. The dangers of social media are just as real but for some reason many parents feel that disregarding the age restrictions that apply is ok in this instance. There is much evidence to the contrary. I would encourage all parents to think about the access their children have to the internet and social media in particular. https://www.esafety.gov.au/esafetyinformation. It is worth remembering that we are the adults in the situation. Children do not always know what is best for them. As parents we often have to make hard decisions for the good of our children. Responsible access to the internet is an example of this.
