

As you know, our school mission goal is to try to become the 'living body of Christ' and to apply the message of the Scripture into our lives. One way that we can do that is to reach out to those more needy than ourselves.

Over 2.9 million people in Australia live below the poverty line and out of that number over 731,000 are children under the age of 15. A Social Justice campaign that we are supporting this year is the Vinnies Winter Appeal.

This means that we will be asking each child to donate a can of food to help out those who may be struggling this Winter. It might be a can of soup, spaghetti, beans, salmon, tuna, vegetables..... The children can bring in the can/s of food and leave it in their classroom donation basket.

On Friday June 28 at 9.15am we will be celebrating a Mass for the Feast of the Sacred Heart. We will be able to incorporate the meaning of the Sacred Heart to the actions of our students and their donations to the appeal.

Support such as this helps to make our school a better place and shows the special community that is Our Lady of Lourdes.






We will be having a pie and sausage roll Meal Deal as well as a pie drive on Friday July 5th.
