Respect Responsibility Readiness to Learn Dear Families of Our Lady of Lourdes,

In this Sunday's Gospel reading, Matthew 18:15-20, Jesus addresses a common occurrence in the Christian community: a dispute between two members of the community. Jesus sets out the steps we need to take in moving towards reconciliation.

Conflict and disagreements are a natural part of life. Yet, when we experience conflicts, we have an important opportunity to learn how to resolve disagreements fairly by treating people with love and respect.

If we have a disagreement with someone we should always try to resolve the matter first with the other person involved, by talking with them gently. If that doesn't work, then we may need to get the help of others. Jesus wants us to lovingly try to help each other obey God.

Jesus also teaches us in Sunday's reading that he will be with us when we pray to him about the conflicts in our lives. Prayer is also an important part of handling conflict. Each time we celebrate the Eucharist we are sent forth to "Go in peace". This is an incredible challenge. The words, "Go in peace" means much more than to leave with a good feeling. It means that we leave church with the intention of making peace happen in our personal lives and in what happens around us. We must all do the small, everyday things that strengthen our relationships with those around us. And we are also responsible to act as part of the human family.

*"Forgiveness, dialogue, reconciliation, these are the words of peace .... let us pray for peace, and let us bring it about starting in our own homes". Pope Francis.*

Trial. This trial aimed to assess our school's bandwidth, wireless connectivity and readiness to move towards students undertaking the NAPLAN Tests in an online platform in 2019.

Our trial was successful with students being able to access, connect and complete the tests with no major issues. As this readiness test is not a test of the individual children's academic performance but a test of the technical aspects of administering NAPLAN Online, parents and schools will not receive individual student performance results. Our school will be provided with the opportunity to provide feedback with respect to our experience in this trial.
























# Father's Day at OLOL
