### Field Events for Zone and Diocesan Athletics

If your child would like to be considered for Zone or Diocesan Athletics for Discus and/or High Jump you need to bring your Little Athletics Achievement Record and give it Miss Geekie as soon as possible. Below are the qualifying heights and distances.

### **Discus:**

Junior Girls 500gms Qualifying distance - 12m Junior Boys 500gms Qualifying distance – 14m 11 yrs Girls 750gms Qualifying distance – 13m 11 yrs Boys 750gms Qualifying distance – 15m Senior Girls 750gms Qualifying distance - 14m Senior Boys 750gms Qualifying distance - 16m

### **High Jump:**

Junior Qualifying height – 1.00m 11 yrs Qualifying height – 1.05m Senior Qualifying height - 1.10m

### **NEW FINANCE SYSTEM**

No further payments can be made this term as we migrate to the new finance system.

As from Monday, 17th July there will be a change in the way we process receipts. Receipts will be emailed to parents/caregivers nominated on the enrolment form. In preparation all families are asked to ensure that the school has the correct family email address. If there have been any changes please notify the office so that student records can be updated accordingly. Please also make sure your current Home/Mobile/Business numbers are up to date as well.

We ask for your patience and understanding during this time.

### **Student Attendance**

What if my child has to be away from school for a day?

If your child has to be absent from school, you must tell the school and provide a reason for your child's absence. To explain an absence parents and carers may:

- · send a note or email the school
- telephone the school, or
- visit the school office and tell us in person

If the school does not receive an explanation for an absence a note will be sent to request a reason for the child's absence.

What if my child has to be away from school for part of a day?

Children need to arrive to school and class on time. Lateness to school or leaving early from school must be recorded as a partial absence. If your child is late to school a parent or carer must come into the office with your child and sign the child in, giving a reason for the partial absence. Similarly if a child is picked up early, a parent or carer must come into the office and sign the child out, giving a reason for the partial absence. This process is to ensure your child's safety.

If the school does not receive an explanation for a partial absence, parents will be contacted by telephone, followed by a letter to request a reason for the child's absence.

### **Out and About**

Every year at this time I am surprised about how quickly the year has



flown. By the end of this week we will have completed Semester One and students and teachers alike are looking forward to the July holidays. During this week each year we hold our half yearly Parent/Teacher interviews. A time when we can celebrate the growth that each child has made while at the same time setting goals for the future. It is an opportunity for us to grow the partnership that exists between the school and parents. A partnership that, as with any partnership, is built on mutual trust and respect. I have spoken on many occasions of the leap of faith that parents take when they entrust their children to us in Kindergarten. Hopefully, as the years progress, this becomes less a leap of faith and more a situation where parents are confident that their child is in good hands. Sometimes parents may not be sure of the rationale behind decisions made at school. This is where the trust comes in. It may not always be obvious why a decision is made and from time to time we may change the way things are done, but it is always with the best interest of the child in mind. As always if you do have a question or concern we are happy to work with you in a mutually respectful manner. The great news is that parents and teachers want the very best for the children in our care. It was great to see last night so many parents take this opportunity to work together with the teachers and so many good news stories shared. This afternoon I saw many parents enjoying the Dance Fever concert and tomorrow night I will join with Miss Byrnes and other staff at the Dance Fever Interschool Challenge just two more ways that we work together for the benefit of vour children. As we move towards the holidays I would like to take this opportunity to thank all those parents who have helped and supported the school in any way this term. Enjoy the break with your children. I look forward to working with you again next term.
