Respect Responsibility Readiness to Learn Dear Parents

Welcome to Term 2. Kindergarten are now well and truly 'big school kids' and I saw lots of eager faces from children of all ages as they walked through the school gates yesterday morning. The teachers have been hard at work in the holidays preparing for the term ahead. If you have been up to school you would have seen our mystery tent, a cause of great excitement and a great encouragement for the children to write. Yesterday, after lunch, we had a small ceremony at school to commemorate Anzac Day. I was very struck by the reverence the children displayed- they know how important and sad death in war is. Our Catholic view is that we celebrate Peace rather than glorify war. We highlight the tragedy of deaths of ordinary soldiers and civilians but believe in the power of love over hate. After all Jesus was a victim of war. He was killed by an army of occupation, tortured and died an agonising death. His death was justified politically by the Jewish leaders and even his friend Judas who became cynical about the

power of love. However his resurrection was a victory against death, victory against the evil of violence and war.

I pray that no child at OLOL will ever have to be involved in the horror of war.

Winter Uniform

ABSENCES

Please remember to send a note to explain any absences from school. A phone call to the school office is only necessary if the absence will be for more than two days.

ASSEMBLY MANNERS

We request that all parents respect and consider the students facilitating assemblies by switching off all mobiles, not talking to those around them and ensuring toddlers aren't too noisy. Furthermore, we would ask that students are not collected between 2:00pm and 2:50pm as collecting students in the audience is disturbing to those presenting. Should you need to collect your child(ren) during this time, when Friday assembly is on, we request that they are collected prior to 2:00pm to ensure no interruptions. Thank you for your assistance in this matter.

School Hours

Supervision on the playground commences at **8.10am** each morning. Our school day then commences at **8.40am**.



Children should be ready for class at this time.

Recess is 10.40am - 11.00am
Lunch is 1.00pm - 1.50pm
Final dismissal time is 2.50pm.
Supervision finishes at 3.20pm and all children should be collected by this time. If a student is within the school outside these times the OLOL Out of School Hours facility is available. Thank you.

COMPLAINTS AND GRIEVANCES COMMUNICATION

Parents are reminded that teachers are always available to discuss any area of grievance provided an appointment time has been established through the Office Staff or a note given to the teacher from the student. Please remember the first point of contact should be with the Class Teacher. If there is still a point of issue then please follow the school guidelines which outline the avenues of communication to follow. The Teacher, the Stage Coordinator, The Assistant Principal, The Principal to the Diocesan Office where there is also an order of avenues to follow.

Out and About

Returning to school for another term it was great to see so much enthusiasm. A number of the children I spoke to yesterday morning told me that they were happy to be back at school – eager to see their friends and to get back into the school routine.

Whilst we have been on holidays there have been a number of changes around the school. Some of the most obvious are in the carpark. Parents will notice that we have had "No Entry" and "Exit Only" signs installed at the exit of the carpark. This is to reinforce to all carpark users the correct direction of the traffic flow. We will continue to put the witch's hats across the lower carpark entry after 8:10am in the morning meaning that **NO** car should enter the lower carpark after this time. Even if you need to visit the office you are asked to park in the upper carpark outside the Church - this is to ensure the safety of all children. We have also had numbers painted in the Kiss and Drop zone to indicate the two clear parking spaces to be used for Kiss and Drop. Can all parents please make sure that if they are the first car in the line that they move up into the first Kiss and Drop space allowing for a second car to pull in behind. This will allow for a greater number of cars to move through the Kiss and Drop zone in a shorter period of time. Members of the school Leadership team will be reminding parents to do this when they are on Kiss and Drop duty.

Moving further into the school we have had fresh sand placed into the large sand pit, the hand rails re-painted, bag lockers installed in Year 6 and courtesy of the OOSH committee the Creative Arts room has had a renovation to upgrade the facilities for OOSH which in turn provides improved amenities for the school. Not to mention the mysterious tent on the playground! Make sure you take time to have a look at the changes around our school.
