The News in RE



on the weekend in Paris can really at times test our faith. It can also be extremely difficult to answer the questions of our children when they witness disturbing stories on the news such as the ones on the weekend. It is times like these when we can turn to Christ for comfort and some answers.

This coming Sunday we are reminded that we must look for the peace of Christ in the Kingdom of Christ as we celebrate the feast of Christ the King. The feast day was instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925 and does not so much celebrate a specific event in the history of salvation, but rather honours our Saviour Himself under the title of king. The feast is celebrated on the last Sunday of Ordinary Time just before Advent begins and was originally instituted to counteract the growing secularism and atheism.

Whatever the motivations for the horrific acts carried out in Paris were, we can 'gain strength and courage from the celebration of the feast, as we are reminded that Christ must reign in our hearts, minds, wills, and bodies' (Quas Primas, 33). Christ was clear in what He wants from us and modelled it for us during his life. Christ's kingship is one of humility and service. When the children witness these stories on the news it is important that the focus is on the helpers: the paramedics, the police officers, the people lining up to donate blood, the people offering their prayers. They are the people who are Christ's hands here on earth.

The 9:30am Mass this Sunday will be Year 6 and their buddies Family Mass. All families are welcome to come along and pray for peace and for the Kingdom of Christ.
