Dear Parents,

Our community has been very generous in fundraising to offset the cost of sending three of our teachers to World Youth Day. Miss Bentley, Miss Musgrave and Miss Mercado are our pilgrims. World Youth happens at the very beginning of next term.



What is World Youth Day and why are they going?

World Youth day is a gathering of young Catholics from across the world, lead by the Pope, celebrating and learning about their faith. World Youth Day was begun by Pope John Paul, who is now a saint. John Paul came from Poland and courageously stood up to the Communists. The strength of the church in Poland helped to make a peaceful transition to democracy. This year's World Youth day is therefore in Krakow, Poland.

Living a life of faith in a secular world is a difficult thing for young people. World Youth Day gives a sense of belonging to something bigger than themselves and their country, something that is working for good in the world. Under the leadership of Pope Francis, the Catholic Church is more than buildings and more than an institution, it is people, inspired by the love of God, working together to improve the world.

Our school, admittedly only a tiny part of the world, needs inspired people like that too and that is why we are sending some of our teachers. They will return from their pilgrimage more able to work as Catholic school teachers and leaders. It is therefore the highest professional development that we can give to them. The diocese supports the pilgrimage of teachers to Poland and many high school students also have that opportunity too.

Is a pilgrimage a holiday?

World Youth Day is a pilgrimage, very different to a holiday. In 2008 when Sydney hosted World Youth Day some pilgrims stayed at our school. They slept in classrooms that were cold at night and shared a single makeshift shower block constructed from plywood. Accommodation in Poland may be a little better than that, however is still very basic. This is because the point of a pilgrimage is spiritual development not relaxation. World Youth Day culminates in a large outdoor mass with up to a million pilgrims attending the mass and this requires miles of walking, camping overnight. Our teacher pilgrims will be supervising a group of teenage pilgrims so will be working hard to keep them safe and focused.

I wish our pilgrims well as they prepare for their exciting journey.

The News in RE

As we approach the last few weeks of term, the final piece of the puzzle on the Mercy Wall has been revealed. The message reads:

Transform me O God,

That my hands may be merciful,

That I use them to serve my neighbour

Each of the actions that the children have participated in has specifically been selected with the purpose of serving others. This is the whole purpose of the works of mercy. As I wrote previously, when we are consciously making a decision to help and care for another person, particularly the poor and downtrodden, we are demonstrating God's love and mercy for all. Since my previous column, we have sheltered the homeless by donating blankets and long life milk to the Franciscan Friars Coffee van that serves the homeless men and women living in the CBD on a weekly basis. This week we visited the imprisoned by constructing a mercy brick wall in the Library to show our solidarity with refugees and others who have been denied their right of freedom. Next week, we will carry out our final action: clothe the naked. This action will require the children to donate clothes (preferably new) for the toddlers and children living in Bohol in the Philippines who were devastated by a hurricane 18 months ago. Miss Musgrave and myself will personally deliver these clothes to the children, as we will be spending four days working in this community before heading onto World Youth day in Poland.

Miss Mercado, Miss Musgrave and I are now nearing the end of our formation sessions and are busily preparing for our pilgrimage. In many ways, we wish we could take the whole community with us. Each teacher will be organising a way for their class to be part of the iournev. Miss Musgrave's class will be putting together a prayer kit to give to the children in the Philippines. Miss Mercado will be asking the families in Year 1 to contribute to her book of prayer intentions that she will bring and pray for during the pilgrimage. My class will construct a number of prayer petitions that I will pray throughout the pilgrimage on their behalf particularly during Masses with Pope Francis and as I travel onto Rome.

I would like to thank Mrs Regan for taking on the Religious Coordinator role while I am away and I look forward to seeing you all when I get back. Thank you all for your continued support and prayers for all our pilgrims.
