Peer Review 2018

Each year all Primary and Secondary schools in Parramatta Diocese engage in the process of Peer Review to present curriculum documentation and obtain critical feedback from peers in a professional learning context. In the last week of Term 1 OLOL was involved in this annual process. The process of Peer Review allows all schools to view, assess and provide critical feedback on the curriculum that will form a point of focus. The process of Peer Review also enables all schools to assure that they are fully compliant according to NESA and CEDP requirements.

This year OLOL presented curriculum documentation in the area of Religious Education and Creative Arts for Kindergarten. My thanks and congratulations to Miss Marlee Broughton, Miss Stephanie Musgrave, Mrs Janelle Bawden and Mrs Clare Willemse who were responsible for preparing and presenting at Peer Review in 2018, ably supported by Mrs Carol Cividin.

The feedback given to OLOL was very positive and included some of the following statements.

Religious Education

The scope & sequence is aligned with Sharing Our Story. Good practice is that there is a whole school peer review to ensure outcomes align with the scope & sequence. The assessment plan incorporates assessment AS, OF and FOR learning. It is well organised and aligns with the

scope & sequence and it matches the outcomes. The teaching & learning program incorporates all the necessary elements and shows evidence of teacher evaluations of student learning. There is great incorporation of the 3 senses of scripture. Students are able to reflect on lessons and are given opportunities to apply their learning. There are detailed annotations in the programs. All

assessments aligned with the scope & sequence and Assessment Plans and this is reflected in the program. Evaluations of student learning and the success of teaching tasks are evident in the program. Student use of Learning Intentions and Success Criteria for next steps of learning is also evident. Student self assess within the program. Student work samples of assessments were presented showing high, middle and low achievement levels. These have very detailed annotations with rubrics. Differentiation is reflected through the incorporation of open ended tasks.

Creative Arts

The scope & sequence was clear and easy to read. Good practice is that the school has compliance meetings once a term to ensure they are compliant with outcomes and content. The assessment plan links to the assessment tasks and is very clear to understand. There is a comprehensive 5 point grading system which is very detailed and can give accurate information about the students to parents. The programs are very well set out and easy to read and follow. There are inks to other KLAs including RE which incorporates Catholic Values. Annotations on programs reflect where changes are made and take into consideration student interests and engagement. These are quite clear and easy to read. Sharing of markbooks to share grades between colleagues is a great idea. Plenty of varied work samples were provided including digital and hard copies. Rubrics were attached to samples which makes it easy to see different levels of students' work.

NATIONAL ASSESSMENT PROGRAM Literacy and Numeracy

Next week our Year 3 and Year 5 students will sit the NAPLAN exams. These will take place on Tuesday the 15th (Language Conventions and Writing), Wednesday the 16th (Reading) and Thursday the 17th of May (Numeracy). These examinations take place nationwide and give an indication of student's proficiency in Literacy and Numeracy. It should be remembered that these exams, whilst important, provide us with only a snapshot of a child's performance on a given day and must be considered in light of all the other information we know about the child. Never the less, the Year 3 and Year 5 teachers have been providing the students with opportunities to experience NAPLAN like activities so that they are familiar with the format when it comes to the exams and feel encouraged and supported throughout the experience. RE NEWS

Sunday Mass is a time to give thanks to God for all that has happened in our lives and it is a time to call out to God, asking for help in all the things that are about to happen in our lives.
