# **Facilities at OLOL**

In Term 3 (Week 4 newsletter) we informed the community of further facilities work to be undertaken to continue to improve the environment at OLOL. As you know the carpark has been resurfaced during the recent school holidays and the line marking was completed last night. There are a few minor works on the carpark still to be completed during this term.

In addition to the car park, we also informed the community that further work will take place to rectify and resurface the basketball court, renew the basketball hoops, make good the current uneven concrete edges surrounding the court and lay synthetic grass surrounding the basketball court. In addition to this plan play equipment will be installed adjacent to the basketball court that meets all Australian Safety Standards. Today we were advised that the work on the next stage of the playground will begin next week with the erecting of safety fences. The goal is to have the works completed by Christmas and in time for the 2019 school year.

We are very grateful as these works will happen as result of the support of Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta to improve the facilities for our children.

As with all construction works there will be some short term inconvenience. At this point access will still be maintained to the school through the gate near the current car park but fencing will establish a corridor for pedestrian traffic to access the school in general and specifically OOSH, the recently refurbished playground and the bubblers at the end of Year 6. Full details of any further adjustments that may be required will be communicated in a timely manner.

This construction work will make a massive difference to the appearance and quality of the playground for the children for 2018 and well into the future.

God we ask that our students feel your closeness during the HSC exam period. Give them calm hearts and quiet confidence in the knowledge that you hold them in the palm of your hand.



# ARE YOU LEAVING?



If your child/children will not be returning to Our Lady of Lourdes in 2019, would you kindly inform the office as soon as possible.

The Catholic Education Office policy relating to the notice required from parent to terminate their children's enrolment in the schools of the Parrramatta Diocese. In part state that "A term's notice" (10 weeks) in writing must be given to the Principal before the removal of any student or a full term's fees will be paid. The notice can be given any time during the term for the next term. A form is available from the school office.

This means that unless the school receives a term's notice no pro rata adjustment will be given for part term tuition.

Notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following year's enrolment. In this circumstance the requirement of 10 weeks notice will be waived.

## **2019 Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials**

Primary students enrolled in Year 5 and 6 in 2019 are invited to participate in the Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials during Term Four in 2018 and Term One & Two in 2019.

It is important to note that these trials are generally for those children who display an above average ability and/or have representative experience in their chosen sport.

Parramatta Diocesan trials will be held in the following sports:

AFL (boys), Basketball (B&G), Cricket (B&G), Diving (B&G), Hockey (B&G), Football (B&G), Golf (B&G), Hockey (B&G), Netball (girls), Rugby League (11yrs & Opens), Rugby Union (boys), Softball (B&G), Tennis (B&G) and Touch Football (B&G).

To be eligible for selection for these trials an Online Team Registration Form must be completed that can be accessed via the website <a href="https://www.primarysportparra.catholic.edu.au">www.primarysportparra.catholic.edu.au</a>.

Please note that your online registration is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST ONLY** and **MUST be approved by the child's school**. In order for the child to attend the nominated trial or event this may come down to the discretion of the school as to who is selected to attend the trial. In some sports only 2 students per school can be nominated.

All fields and especially "Representative Experience" MUST be completed.

Under no circumstances will a child be eligible to trial if the Online Registration

Form has not been completed and approved by the school by the closing date.

One form is to be completed per child, per individual sport. Each sport has its own criteria therefore, it is imperative that the correct form is completed.

Currently only the Summer Sports of BASKETBALL & TENNIS are open and registrations close on Wednesday 31<sup>st</sup> October as these trials will be held in November 2018.

All OTHER sport registrations will open in November for 2019 trials.

# **Swim Survive Lessons**



Our annual 'Swim and Survive' program started on Monday 22nd of October (Week 2) and will continue each day through to Wednesday 31st of October. Each year all of the students from Kindergarten to Year 6 participate in 8 daily swimming lessons to develop their skills and knowledge in water safety. Water safety skills are extremely important for children to develop, especially as we head into the summer months. The students participate in the 'Active Program' teaching a range of skills and knowledge to develop swimming, water safety, survival and basic rescue skills. The program encourages children to have a healthy respect for the aquatic environment and is aligned with the National Swimming and Water Safety framework, developing the following skills:

- Entry and exit skills
- Floating and sculling skills
- Movement and swimming strokes
- Survival and PFD skills
- Underwater skills
- Rescue skills
- Water safety knowledge

Parents are welcome to attend the centre to view your child's progress but we ask that you remain in the designated viewing areas. Please see the reception staff upon arrival at the centre prior to entering the viewing areas.

If you have any questions regarding these lessons please see your child's teacher for further clarification.

The children thoroughly enjoy this experience and learn many new skills that they can apply around water.

# **Mission to Busk**

At Our Lady of Lourdes, the children are invited to participate in a fundraising event that will give them the opportunity to share their talents with our community and help those less fortunate than themselves. The **Mission to Busk** fundraising event will take place on Friday November 9 between 1.30pm and 2.40pm on the school playground. ☐ The buskers will perform their act a number of times over a 30-minute period. They will need to provide their own portable music player/music as they may be outside.

As part of Mission activities, the students are encouraged to donate their gold and silver coins to the buskers. We ask that children bring in a number of gold or silver coins to throw into the buckets of those children performing, with all funds raised being donated to the missions.

Depending on the number of students, there will be two busking sessions – the first will be from 1.30 pm - 2.00 pm and the second will be from 2.10 pm - 2.40 pm.

We are looking forward to enjoying all of the talent that OLOL children have.
