


Facilities at OLOL – Construction Work

Thank you for your cooperation as construction works continue. Though there is some inconvenience during construction we look forward to further improvements to the playground for the children. Progress in the past week includes:

- Grinding and patching of existing surface of basketball court
- Acrylic surface applied
- Line marking of basketball and netball court







Facilities at OLOL – Announcement of Further Construction Work

I write with exciting news about further improvements to the facilities at OLOL. We have been recently advised that further work will take place to build a covered outdoor learning area (COLA) to be situated outside of Year 5 and 6. The COLA will be a permanent covering providing shade and protection from rain. The COLA will include natural and artificial lighting, acoustic treatment and the paving will be resurfaced with synthetic turf. Works will include establishing sliding doors from Year 5 and 6 effectively extending available learning space as well as removing subsiding pavers and establishing a level concrete area outside of the existing OOSH.

The program of works will commence early in January 2019 before the beginning of the school year and are anticipated to be completed in March 2019. As with all construction works there will be some short term inconvenience. However, interruptions will be kept to a minimum. Access to the school, OOSH and playgrounds will be maintained but will require some alternate routes and safety fencing. All WHS and Australian Building Standards will be maintained. Full details of any adjustments that will need to be made will be communicated in a timely manner before the beginning of the 2019 school year. As further details are confirmed I will inform you as soon as practicable.

These works will happen as result of the support of Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta to improve the facilities for our children. This construction work will make a massive difference to the appearance and quality of the facilities for the children for 2019 and well into the future.

Last Sunday was the beginning of Advent. Advent is a time to remember the many and varied ways that God continues to be present in the world. The first Sunday of Advent also sees the commencement of the new liturgical year. You will notice that the liturgical cloth and the priest's garments are primarily purple in colour. This indicates a period of preparation to celebrate The Birth of Jesus.

Celebrating with an Advent wreath during the weeks prior to Christmas is a great way for Christian families to keep Christ at the center of Christmas, and for parents to teach their children the true meaning of Christmas.

The colours of the candles in the Advent wreath are purple, pink and white. One candle is lit each week at mass.

- The first candle (purple) that is lit is sometimes called the Prophecy Candle or the Candle of Hope.
- The second candle (purple) is the Bethlehem Candle or the Candle of Preparation.
- The third candle (pink) is The Shepherd Candle or the Candle of Joy.
- The fourth candle is (purple) The Angel Candle or the Candle of Love.
- The final candle (white) is lit on Christmas Day and is called the Christ Candle.

Christmas time is a very busy time for many people but there should always be time to pray. It only takes a few moments. Sometimes we feel that we are too busy to do this. I invite you to make some sacred space in your day, especially during Advent. Any place can be a sacred space and it will only take a few moments to share some of your time with Jesus.

You might like to take a few moments to quietly say this prayer before you start each day. Enjoy talking to God and enjoy your day!!!!



Reporting Student Learning K - 6

Next Friday 7th December you will receive your child's report for Semester 2. These reports are only one way of gaining information about your child and their academic progress. We encourage you to also look through your child's workbooks and work samples that will be sent home in the last week of school.

The report communicates information about your child's learning

- for all seven Key Learning Areas (KLAs)
 - o Religion
 - o English
 - Mathematics
 - Human Society and its Environment
 - Science and Technology
 - o Personal Development, Health and Physical Education
 - o Creative Arts ·
- using a scale of achievement.

What is a Scale of Achievement?

Kindergarten learning reports communicate individual achievement in all areas according to the following scale:

Your child's effort for each area is reported using a three-point scale:

- Improvement Required
- Satisfactory
- Commendable

The number of students achieving at various levels is determined:

- by the year group's achievements
- it is not by a mathematical formula

For Years 1 to 6 the number of students achieving at each level E - A is stated on your child's report for each key learning area.

Comments In the Semester 2 Report a comment section has been included for Religion, English and Mathematics as well as a general comment. In the Key Learning areas of Religion, English and Mathematics the comments take the form of dot points. The first set of dot points relate to what the student is able to do and the next set of dot points give suggestions as to the next step for the student in relation to the Key Learning Area.

The general comment at the end of the report gives the teacher an opportunity to comment on the work habits and social aspects of each child.

As throughout the year, parents have the opportunity to discuss their child's performance. Should you wish to have a meeting with your child's teacher, please contact the office or your child's teacher to make an appointment at a mutually convenient time.

ARE YOU LEAVING

If your child/children will not be returning to Our Lady of Lourdes in 2019, would you kindly inform the office as soon as possible. The Catholic Education Office policy relating to the notice required from parents to terminate their children's enrolment in the schools of the Parramatta Diocese, in part states that, "A term's notice (10 weeks) in writing must be given to the Principal before the removal of any student or a full term's fees will be paid". The notice can be given any time during the term for the next term. A form is available from the school office.

This means that unless the school receives a term's notice no pro rata adjustment will be given for part term tuition. Notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following year's enrolment. In this circumstance the requirement of 10 weeks notice will be waived.



Tomorrow December 6th is the final day for uniform appointments for 2018. The uniform shop will be open on Tuesday 22nd January, 2019 for appointments or if you know the size you are welcome to drop in on this day between the hours of 8.30am and 3.30pm and purchase.



School Uniform

Children are required to wear full school uniform at all times including appropriate haircuts and limited jewelry. Parents' support is essential to ensure their child wears correct school uniform each day.

The following information and images provide clarity about school expectations upon the return of students to school in 2019.

Boys hair is to be kept neat and tidy, off the collar, of consistent natural colour, of gradual even grade and all extremes of fashion are to be avoided. Some examples of "styles" that are unacceptable include: ridges, lines, undercuts, steps, bowl cuts, any excessive shaping with gel, and any shaving cuts. The school reserves the right to make rulings on the acceptability of any student hairstyles.

Girls hair is to be of consistent natural colour. Hair that is longer than shoulder length is to be tied back from the face. Hair is to be off the face and out of the eyes. Ribbons, hair slides etc, if worn should be in the uniform fabric or blue. Scrunchies are sold from the Uniform Shop.
