Laudato Si' On Care for Our Common Hame POPE PRANCIS

Laudato Si is an encyclical written by Pope Francis in 2015. A papal encyclical is one of the highest forms of communication by the pope and usually deals with some aspect of Catholic teaching- clarifying, amplifying, condemning or promoting one or a number of issues. In his encyclical Pope Francis urgently appealed " for a new dialogue about how we are shaping the future of our planet. We need a conversation which includes everyone, since the environmental challenges we are undergoing, and its human roots, concern and affect us all. The worldwide ecological movement has already made considerable progress and led to the establishment of numerous organisations committed to raising awareness of these challenges."

Brother Frank Richardson will be conducting a discussion group in the parish meeting room on Thursday morning, starting at 9.00am, to discuss the themes and how we can "Live Laudato Si." There will be discussion on themes of ecological conversion leading to personal, parish and community action. # Tell Them From Me (TTFM) Partners in Learning Survey



The feedback overall has been extremely positive and I will take the opportunity to share some of the key aspects of these reports with you over a number of weeks in the school newsletter. Below is some feedback on two aspects of the survey: "Parents support learning at home" and "School supports learning".

## **Parent Survey**

**You said:** You rated parents support learning at home 7.6 out of 10




#### **Parent Survey**

We asked: Do you feel teachers have high expectations for your child to succeed, show interest in your child's learning, expect your child to work hard and do their best work?

**You said:** You rated school supports learning 7.8 out of 10

We say: You rated our school above the norm for the Diocese. It also seems compared to 2018 we have improved in this area. We really are on the same page. Like you we want your child to succeed in their learning.



#### Peer Review 2019

Each year all Primary and Secondary schools in Parramatta Diocese engage in the process of Peer Review to present curriculum documentation and obtain critical feedback from peers in a professional learning context. Last week OLOL was involved in this annual process. The process of Peer Review allows all schools to view, assess and provide critical feedback on the curriculum that will form a point of focus. The process of Peer Review also enables all schools to assure that they are fully compliant according to NESA and CEDP requirements.

This year OLOL presented curriculum documentation in the area of English and Mathematics for Year 5 and Year 6. My thanks and congratulations to Mrs Elise Clynick, Mr Wayne Owen, Miss Donna Muddle and Ms Toni Critchlow who were responsible for preparing and presenting at Peer Review in 2019, ably supported by Mrs Carol Cividin.

The feedback given to OLOL was very positive and included some of the following statements.

#### English

The scope & sequence is comprehensive and clear and concise around the outcomes, and elements of language. A commendation is that the school uses a similar process to peer review to check scope & sequences and ensure they are aligned with teaching programs and the syllabus. The assessment plan is comprehensive and has excellent links to the rubrics. The program is clear and easy to follow. Students can track their own learning, set their own goals and differentiate their own learning. A commendation is the work modifying programs to suit students who are working beyond stage level. The teachers utilise a good range of teaching skills, and consistently target a variety of skills across English. Evaluations give insight into what needs to be taught next or revised in coming weeks. There is a very thorough analysis of where the students are at with their learning. The school is very well resourced and uses ICT effectively as a learning tool and a tool for reflection.


#### Mathematics

The scope & sequence is clear, easy to understand and includes all necessary elements. A commendation is that the document highlights that each outcome for the stage is covered throughout the year. The work samples and teaching program clearly align with the school's scope & sequence. The school ensures consistency across the school and teachers follow agreed practices. Collaboration (of teachers) ensures that consistent judgement is used when assessing students. The teaching programs are detailed and showed a sequence of learning experiences with outcomes. Differentiation for students is very evident. Focus groups are used to support students further where needed. Teachers collaborate daily to build on learning experiences. There is thorough recording of grades which align to the scope & sequence and assessment plan. Work samples show differentiation for individual students. Mathematics is well resourced.

#### Attendance

Our challenge is to meet a minimum target of 90% attendance every day.

At the conclusion of Friday week 3, we have fallen short of our target of 90% at **84.1%**.



Congratulations to Year K and 4 who achieved the 90% attendance target! We know all grades can achieve this target and everyone's learning improves when there is regular and timely attendance.

## Out and About - Book Week



My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The case involving Cardinal Pell on historic child sexual abuse crimes has again dominated the media and public discourse following the appeal decision that was handed down today.

We respect that decision and the process of law.

We know that for some, this case has reopened existing wounds and past traumas. I want to reiterate our support to the victims of abuse and to all those who are hurting.

As the Bishop of Parramatta with responsibility for the Catholic Church in Western Sydney and the Blue Mountains, I remain absolutely committed to protecting children in our care from harm.

I am determined to enable survivors of abuse to have a voice and are responded to in a caring, practical, and meaningful way.

Catholic parish communities in the Diocese of Parramatta have support mechanisms in place to help those in need.

At a parish level, I would encourage you to reach out to your parish priest for help.

At a diocesan level, we strongly encourage anyone who has been affected by abuse from within the Catholic Church to contact the Diocese of Parramatta via our Office of Safeguarding & Professional Standards on (02) 8838 3419 or safeguarding@parracatholic.org.

Any concerns or allegations about any criminal offence should be reported to NSW Police on 131 444.

During this period of continued crisis and deep darkness, as the Catholic Church, let us pray for the survivors of abuse, their families and all those affected.

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

We believe that all human beings are made in the image of God and that all human beings matter.

The Church maintains the vigorous defence of the dignity of the human person. This includes the protection of life from conception to natural death.

I have been closely following this abortion debate as it has unfolded in our parliament and across the public sphere. I join my voice with my brother bishops and many people of goodwill across many faiths who are alarmed at the newly-proposed NSW abortion legislation.

It is not enough to argue that this legislation is simply about "decriminalising abortion." What's at stake is far more complex and goes to the heart of a healthy society. As human beings, we all have a responsibility to care for each other.

Pope Francis reminds us bluntly: "It is not right to kill a human being, regardless of how small it is, to solve a problem."

Whilst we affirm the sacredness of all life, the Church as a community of faith, hope and love stands by pregnant women to offer them support. That is why, closely linked to protection of the unborn is the ongoing care of women who are pregnant, especially those in difficult personal circumstances.

Our legislators and community need to provide more practical care and compassion to women facing these decisions.

In our diocese, our CatholicCare services offers a comprehensive pregnancy-related service for women and families that are expecting a baby. We want to help women in these complex situations.

Being born into this wondrous planet of ours is a blessing. May each of us, given this precious gift, never forget to pray with the Psalmist: "You created my inmost self, knit me together in my mother's womb. For so many marvels I thank you; a wonder am I, and all your works are wonders." Psalms 139.

This is an ongoing critical issue where the Church will continue to speak prophetically.
