Principal's Message



Dear Families of Our Lady of Lourdes,

My congratulations and thanks to all parents children and staff involved in both the Father's Day celebrations and Wakakirri. It certainly was a big day full of joy and it was a real testament to the community spirit at OLOL. Further photos and reports are in this newsletter.

I also wish to communicate exciting news about further improvements to the facilities at OLOL. We have been recently advised that further work will take place to complete a LED lighting upgrade of all internal lighting at OLOL. This work will address removing existing old fluorescent light boxes in all learning spaces and renewing them with new LED light boxes. This work will ensure quality lighting levels in all spaces with greater energy efficiency. These works will happen as result of the support of Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta to improve the facilities for our children.

Work will commence next Monday 16th September. The majority of work will take place out of school hours and this will have the added advantage of minimising interruptions to the school day.

As with all upgrade works there will be some short term inconvenience. Parents are asked to be aware that there will be skip bins in the carpark. This means the first three parking bays nearest to the gate of the main playground will be unavailable.

This work will make a significant difference to the quality of the facilities for the children for 2019 and well into the future.

Tell Them From Me (TTFM) Partners in Learning Survey






Parent Survey

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The case involving Cardinal Pell on historic child sexual abuse crimes has again dominated the media and public discourse following the appeal decision that was handed down today.

We respect that decision and the process of law.

We know that for some, this case has reopened existing wounds and past traumas. I want to reiterate our support to the victims of abuse and to all those who are hurting.

As the Bishop of Parramatta with responsibility for the Catholic Church in Western Sydney and the Blue Mountains, I remain absolutely committed to protecting children in our care from harm.

I am determined to enable survivors of abuse to have a voice and are responded to in a caring, practical, and meaningful way.

Catholic parish communities in the Diocese of Parramatta have support mechanisms in place to help those in need.

At a parish level, I would encourage you to reach out to your parish priest for help.

At a diocesan level, we strongly encourage anyone who has been affected by abuse from within the Catholic Church to contact the Diocese of Parramatta via our Office of Safeguarding & Professional Standards on (02) 8838 3419 or safeguarding@parracatholic.org.

Any concerns or allegations about any criminal offence should be reported to NSW Police on 131 444.

During this period of continued crisis and deep darkness, as the Catholic Church, let us pray for the survivors of abuse, their families and all those affected.

ARE YOU LEAVING?



If your child/children will not be returning to Our Lady of Lourdes in 2020, would you kindly inform the office as soon as possible.

The Catholic Education Office policy relating to the notice required from parents to terminate their children's enrolment in the schools of the Parrramatta Diocese states that "A term's notice" (10 weeks) in writing must be given to the Principal before the removal of any student or a full term's fees will be paid. The notice can be given any time during the term for the next term. A form is available from the school office.

This means that unless the school receives a term's notice no pro-rata adjustment will be given for part term tuition. Notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following year's enrolment. In this circumstance the requirement of 10 weeks notice will be waived.

Attendance

Our challenge is to meet a minimum target of 90% attendance every day. At the conclusion of yesterday week 8, we have fallen short of our target of 90% at 83.8%.
