Principal's Message



Dear Families of Our Lady of Lourdes,

The parable of the prodigal son that Jesus told us in last Sunday's Gospel invites us to consider the depth of God's mercy and love.

Our familiarity with this parable risks dulling us to its tremendously powerful message. The father in the parable is an image for us of how much God wants to forgive us. In our lives, we are sometimes like the younger son; we wander away from God. At other times, we might be like the older son, jealous of the love and forgiveness that God shows to others. This story speaks to us of the meaning of reconciliation, of God's forgiveness and the mercy God wants us to show to one another. During Lent, we remember this story and we seek to be reconciled with God and others.

In this Gospel God's great love for us has been revealed in Jesus. Through his Passion, Death, and Resurrection, Christ has reconciled us with God and one another.

As we conclude our term, we also enter into the celebration and commemoration of Holy Week, commencing with Palm Sunday. Each word, act and rite of Holy Week points to the enormity of God's love for us. I encourage you to attend our school Holy Week liturgies next week. I also encourage you to attend the Parish Holy Week and Easter liturgies during the school holidays.

I take this early opportunity to wish all our families a happy and blessed Easter in the coming weeks.

Facilities at OLOL - Construction Work

We have almost completed the Covered Outdoor Learning Area (COLA). Thank you for your continued cooperation as construction works continue.

There is progress in regards to access. Access to the school is as follows:

School Access:

- Pedestrian access to the school is now available through the gate entrance near the car park and through the school gate near the Library.
- Children who normally wait in the afternoon on the paved area opposite Year 6 (carline) are to continue to be collected by parents from the hall.

- Handover of the COLA for school use

The uniform shop is open on Tuesday afternoons and Thursday mornings. If you wish to make an appointment to try-on please logon to the website:



Next week we will be celebrating the events of Holy Week at school. On Tuesday, April 9 Kindergarten, Year 1 and Year 2 will be leading the school and telling the story of Palm Sunday and the Last Supper. This will take place in the hall at 8.45am. On Thursday, April 11, Years 3, 4 +6 will lead the school through the Stations of the Cross. This will also be in the hall at 8.45am. All are invited to share in these celebrations as the students share the message of the most important season in our Church.

After we return to school in Term 2, Year 5 will continue the celebrations with an Easter Prayer on Tuesday morning in the hall (8.45am).



On Monday the children participated in a fundraising initiative called K's for Caritas. The purpose of the day was to give the children a small taster of what it is like to face challenges in life and to help them to try to persevere despite the difficulties. All grades completed an obstacle course that proved to be difficult for some and also tiring for others. The children were able to reflect in their classes on the scripture passage Matthew 30:25-40. PROJECT COMPASSION FOR A JUST FUTURE



On Monday 1st April each grade participated in Ks for Caritas for Project Compassion Day. Each grade completed an obstacle course to experience the kilometers people from around the world would cover to fetch water, food or go to school to provide for their needs. For example, one of the stations involved the students walking a beanbag on their head from one end of the basketball to experience what it could have been like to bring water to a family. It was a successful but a rewarding day as the students were able to reflect on the difficulties that people have around the world experience for their everyday life.

The challenge is for students to take a photo of themselves reading, over the holidays, in an unusual place.



Premiers Reading Challenge

As a school we are once again participating in the Premiers Reading Challenge. The challenge officially commenced on March 4th. Logon details for all students including our Kindergarten students were sent home today. Students who participated last year are able to log on using their previous log on. If your child did not receive their logon or you are having trouble accessing the site please contact Mrs Cividin.



Once again Our Lady of Lourdes has the opportunity to participate in an exciting program known as 'Dance Fever.' Dance Fever is where the students learn a variety of dances, which includes Jive, Tango, Waltz, Cha Cha, Foxtrot and Samba where they learn to dance as a 'couple.' Students are also taught progressive dances, where they change partners and dance with 'everyone.' Apart from having fun, students also develop listening skills, co-ordination, social skills, self esteem, confidence and fitness. Due to the positive feedback and enjoyment expressed by our students for this program it will once again be offered throughout Term Two 2019.

Payment for the program is covered from the excursion levy that each family paid with their school fees. The program will run once a week over ten weeks, on Wednesday, with students from Kindergarten to Year Two involved in 30 minute lessons and students from Year 3 to Year 6 involved in 45 minute lessons.

What the program looks like.

Kindergarten – Year Two - students learn a series of dances, including Rock n roll, Foxtrot and party and progressive dances. Hip Hop routines have also been added to the junior program which challenges children beyond partner dances. Each lesson is designed so that students in this age group learn about rhythm and body movements.

Year Three-Year Six - students learn two dance routines in Latin and Ballroom, including Cha Cha, Foxtrot, and an African Ceremonial routine. A big part of our program also teaches students Funk and Hip Hop routines and a series of party and progressive dances. The two structured Latin and Ballroom dances taught during the term are then performed at the Dance Fever Interschool Challenge.

At the end of each school term Dance Fever hosts the "*Dance Fever Interschool Challenge*". This is a spectacular event where children from schools participating in the program utilise the skills they have learnt through a professional production, totally organised by Dance Fever. Students compete from grades Three to Six at Homebush Sports Centre. This showcase event is for the entire school community to thoroughly enjoy. This event will take place on **Wednesday 26th June 2019**. Further information will be made available next term.
