# Out and About

Our Lady of Lourdes has been a hive of activity over the holiday break and in these first weeks as together we begin another year of learning. The physical transformation that has taken place over the break has been amazing with the re-surfaced basketball court and new playground equipment nearing completion and preparation for the COLA (Covered Outdoor Learning Area), well underway.

The students have coped well with the adjusted play areas and there is much excitement and anticipation around the new play equipment. Parents have also have played their part in ensuring that the adjusted pick up and drop off areas are operating smoothly.

A reminder that in the afternoon parents of children in Years 2-6, who are picking up their children from school, are asked to collect them from the hall. Parents are asked not to congregate outside of Year3/4 and the library to collect students as students will not exit through these doors but will go straight to the hall. This is also a high traffic area with children going to OOSH and bus lines exiting through these doors.

It is also important that in the afternoon parents realise that a pick up zone <u>does not</u> operate. Parents must come into the hall to collect their students - this is to ensure student safety and to maintain traffic flow. Parents stopping at the front of the hall and attempting to collect children will be asked to move on by staff. Children are being asked to line up in an orderly fashion in the hall to ensure safe dismissal, staff will direct students to parents as quickly as possible.

In addition parents are requested not to access the school via the hall. The construction zone means that the school grounds are not accessible from the hall other than directly through classrooms. Your cooperation with this matter is greatly appreciated as we work together to ensure the safety and comfort of all our students.

Our Kindergarten students have settled in well. It was lovely to see so many of our new Kindergarten parents interacting with our more experienced parents at our Cheers and Tears morning tea. Listening to the parents they are feeling positive about their children entering the world of "Big School".

Over the next few weeks there are a number of opportunities for parents to visit/ become involved in the school. These include our Opening School Mass, our Parents as Educators courses, our first Parent Group meeting and our Meet the Teacher interviews details of all of these activities can be found elsewhere in the newsletter.

I look forward to working with you all during 2019 to provide the best possible learning opportunities for our students.

### Facilities at OLOL - Construction Work

Thank you for your cooperation as construction works continue. Though there is some inconvenience during construction we look forward to further improvements to the playground for the children.

During the construction works, fences have been erected around the work site and the gate entrance near the car park will not be available for school use. This entrance will be available exclusively for OOSH.

Therefore, there will be the following adjustments:

### **School Access:**

- All pedestrian access to the school will be through the school gate near the Library.
- Children who normally wait in the afternoon on the paved area opposite Year 6 (carline) are to be collected by parents from the hall.
- Adjustments within the school site for the children to access learning areas, playground areas and toilets was explained to the children on the first day of school

### **OOSH Access:**

 Access for parents dropping off and collecting children from OOSH will continue to be available through the gate entrance near the car park as usual. NB This access is for OOSH only.

Progress of the construction in the past weeks include:

- Removal of subsiding paving outside of OOSH and pouring of concrete
- Pouring of footings for Covered Outdoor Learning Area (COLA)
- Establishment of large sliding doors from Year 5 and Year 6 learning spaces to access COLA
- Rectification of internal sliding door in Year 5 and 6 learning space to remove trip hazard
- Stud wall and relocation of Apple TV and screen in Year 5 learning space.
- New pinboards in Year 5 and Year 6
- Significant progress of playground equipment
- Completion of artificial turf surrounding basketball court
- Laying of some soft fall surrounds around the basketball court
- Minimisation of fencing of basketball court

There will be less activity over the next few weeks as we wait for the manufactured steel for the COLA.

If you would like to see the plans for the COLA and progress pictures join us at our Parent Group meeting on the 12th February.

# **CURRICULUM NEWS**

# Why have Mathematical Assessment Interview days?

"The ability to make informed decisions and to interpret and apply mathematics in a variety of contexts is an essential component of students' preparation for life in the 21st century." (Mathematics K-10 Syllabus, p.13)

This Key Learning Area of study is informed by the NSW Syllabus for the Australian Curriculum Mathematics K–6.

Last week the teachers at Our Lady of Lourdes spent two days undertaking the Mathematical Assessment Interview testing of students from K-6. Over 200 students attended the school over these two days to undertake their interview.

The Mathematics K – 6 Syllabus is organised into four strands – one process strand, Working Mathematically, and the three content strands: Number and Algebra, Measurement & Geometry, and Statistics & Probability. Working mathematically encompasses processes that are embedded into the other three strands through the content.

Each year students from Years K-6 participate in a one-on-one Mathematics Assessment Interview with their teacher in order to obtain information about students' strengths and challenges in the areas of place value, counting, addition & subtraction and multiplication & division. This information enables teachers to meet learners at their point of need and to build upon Number skills that are fundamental to learning new concepts.

Students who were not able to attend school last week will undertake their interview with their classroom teacher over the first three weeks back at school.

A big thank you to all parents and children who attended an interview and helped to make this important learning experience at OLOL a successful one.



# **School Uniform**

Children are required to wear full school uniform at all times including appropriate haircuts and limited jewelry. Parents' support is essential to ensure their child wears correct school uniform each day.

The following information and images provide clarity about school expectations upon the return of students to school in 2019.

Boys hair is to be kept neat and tidy, off the collar, of consistent natural colour, of gradual even grade and all extremes of fashion are to be avoided. Some examples of "styles" that are unacceptable include: ridges, lines, undercuts, steps, bowl cuts, any excessive shaping with gel, and any shaving cuts. The school reserves the right to make rulings on the acceptability of any student hairstyles.

Girls hair is to be of consistent natural colour. Hair that is longer than shoulder length is to be tied back from the face. Hair is to be off the face and out of the eyes. Ribbons, hair slides etc, if worn should be in the uniform fabric or blue. Scrunchies are sold from the Uniform Shop.

**Safer Internet Day** raises awareness about the positive role of digital technology and explores ways we can all contribute to creating a better, safer internet. Coordinated by the Office of the eSafety Commissioner in Australia and celebrated in over 130 countries, this year's Safer Internet Day theme is **'Together for a better internet'**.

Parents are encouraged to get involved and support our young people in developing the critical skills required to successfully navigate the online world. These skills take time to develop but they can help us in all areas of life - online and off. We like to call them the 4Rs...

Respect - I treat myself and others the way I like to be treated

**Responsibility** - I am accountable for my actions and I take a stand when I feel something is wrong **Reasoning** - I question what is real

Resilience - I get back up from tough situations

Help spread the word about creating a safer, more positive internet—start a conversation with your child about which of the 4Rs of online safety is most important to them and how can they help build a better internet for everyone.

This year, as part of the wider celebration of Safer Internet Day, we encourage all of our parents, students and teachers to review their privacy settings associated with their social media accounts and adjust as necessary to ensure our own personal safety and privacy.



Use the <u>Privacy Checkup</u> to review and adjust your settings to make sure you're sharing with who you want. You might also want to review photos and posts that someone has tagged you in. If you don't like something you're tagged in, you can remove the tag or ask the person who tagged you to remove the post.



Anyone can view your profile and posts on Instagram. You can make your posts <u>private</u> so that only followers you approve can see them. If your posts are set to private, only your approved followers will see them on hashtag or location pages. You might also want to check that you actually know your <u>followers</u> in real life.



Configure your Snapchat profile to only receive messages from users on your <u>My</u> <u>Friends list</u> and to control who you share your stories with. This might be a good opportunity to review your *MyFriends* list to ensure that you have only people who you know in real life. You might also want to check that <u>SnapMap</u>, a location-based service is disabled for your own personal safety and privacy.

The Office of the eSafety Commissioner's <u>iParent</u> portal is packed with resources to help you address online safety with your children.

# 2019 Diocesan School Fees

13 December 2018

Dear parents and carers

Please find below the Annual Diocesan fees schedule for 2019. The new schedule includes a very modest 2.7% increase on the fees from 2018.

School-based fees will also be limited to a 2.7% increase. School-based fees cover the costs of important things such as technology and school administration.

School fees are generally billed in instalments during Terms 1, 2 and 3. The fee is made up of three main parts:

### 1 Diocesan tuition fee

These are set by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta and are the same for every school. There are **significant sibling discounts** for families with more than one child at a Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta school (it does not have to be the same school).

Those discounts and a list of the annual Diocesan tuition fees for 2019 are outlined below.

# 2. Diocesan Building Levy

This fee is set by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta and is the same for every school. The annual Diocesan building levy for 2019 is \$804. There is only one Diocesan building levy per family with one or more children in a Parramatta Diocesan school or at St Dominic's College, Kingswood and it is billed in instalments over the first 3 terms of the year. A sibling discount of 50% is granted to families with children within the bordering Archdiocese of Sydney and Dioceses of Wollongong and Broken Bay.

### School-based fees

These are determined by the school according to the needs of that school and billable for each child. School-based fees are often called 'resource fees' or 'activity fees'. These fees help schools cover the costs of things like teaching resources, technology, excursions etc.
