Update: Semester 1 Reporting Process

In response to changes to the learning and teaching environment during COVID-19, Our Lady of Lourdes, like other schools in our Diocese, have needed to adjust their assessment and reporting processes. While the report at the end of Term 2 will look different, it will still provide you with valuable information about your child's learning, while complying with government requirements. The 2020 second semester report will return to documenting progress in all key learning areas.

This 2020 first Semester report at OLOL will not use the A-E scale. The report format for this semester will include a number of learning observations of what your child can do focussed on Religious Education, English and Mathematics as well as a general comment. Attendance will show the number of days learning at school, the number of days learning at home and number of days absent as at 5th June, 2020. Your child's report will be sent home on Monday 22nd June.

Additionally, in the last two weeks we have asked each student to reflect on their own learning both at home and at school. This statement will also be included with your child's report.

Of course, school reports never surpass the richness of the learning conversations parents and carers can have with their child's teacher. We understand that you will have many insights to share about your child's current needs, particularly as parents have spent many hours supporting your child's learning at home. On Monday 15th June we will send parents a google form asking you to reflect on what your child was able to do well and what your child found challenging when learning at home. Your reflections will form a significant part of the conversation between you and your child's teacher.

This learning conversation between parents and teachers would normally take place in a face to face meeting. This Semester these conversations will be by telephone. As always we will use the online booking system to make times for these meetings which will take place between Tuesday 23rd June and Wednesday 1st July. The online booking procedures and information will also be sent home on Monday 15th June.

Thank you for being part of our caring Catholic school community. As always, our dedicated teachers welcome conversations about your child's learning and wellbeing.


A suggested option for you would be to display your name card on your passenger visor with either fold back clips or rubber bands as shown below:

It was very uplifting last week to see all our students return to school. From our youngest students to our senior students the joy at seeing and reconnecting with friends was obvious.

We began our week with our “new” normal. Monday morning assembly via a Zoom meeting, kiss and drop and kiss and collect in the morning and afternoon, handwashing before and after breaks, reminders of social distancing as much as is practicable. But after our first day where there were many celebrations, including our red carpet, it was back to face to face learning in earnest.

It was wonderful to see teachers and students once again interacting. Students asking questions and receiving feedback immediately. PE and Creative Arts lessons returned - I even heard our rock band practising again!!

The week was spent reconnecting. Re-establishing relationships and determining “where students were at” after a number of weeks of learning at home to ensure that we are meeting student needs going forwards.

School fee information: Term 2

With many students beginning to gradually return to school this week, I am writing to remind you that we are here to help families experiencing hardship as a result of COVID-19. Since sharing information about our simplified process for assistance with school fees as a result of this financial strain, thousands of local families have contacted Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta for support. A reminder that this simple process is as follows:

- Please provide your details on an online form or download a Fee Relief Request, both available on the CEDP and school website.
- If you do choose to complete the Fee Relief Request (rather than providing your details online) email it to cl@parra.catholic.edu.au or drop it into the school. Don't worry, there is no deadline for completing the forms and your information will be treated in strict confidence. It will also be treated in accordance with the Australian Privacy Principles and our [Privacy Statement](#).
- You can complete a hard copy version of the form available from school.

If you wish to reduce, suspend or cancel your current direct debit arrangements, please send an email to cl@parra.catholic.edu.au. If you have pre-paid your 2020 fees for the full year and would like to be refunded the fees for future terms, please send an email to cl@parra.catholic.edu.au.

A 'Frequently Asked Questions' page is available from your school's website. The downloadable PDF form is also available on the page. Of course, if you would like to have a confidential conversation about any of these matters, contact the school in the first instance.

Earlier in the year, we advised that we would not distribute Term 2 statements until there was greater clarity about the duration of the pandemic. These statements are now being issued to provide clarity for families and will include any refunds related to cancelled excursions. Of course, if your family is experiencing hardship as a result of COVID-19, I strongly encourage you to seek assistance as outlined above.

I also want to explain why Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta schools are not discounting fees for all students at this time. As mentioned above, a very significant number of local families have been directly impacted by COVID-19. We believe assisting these families must be the priority.

Though the delivery of learning and teaching have changed throughout this period, our dedicated teachers have continued their work supporting students. The modest fees that we continue to collect from families who are not directly financially impacted by COVID-19 remain necessary to assist with the costs of schooling.

We are all familiar with our own birthdays, and we celebrate them because they mark the day of the year in which we entered into this life. But did you know you have a second birthday? 😊 Pentecost is the Church's birthday and because you are a part of the body of the Church, it's your celebration as well.

The word Pentecost is Greek and it means "50th day." Fifty days after Easter Sunday, we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and their followers, and the beginning of their earthly ministry to make disciples of all nations. At Pentecost, the Apostles and their followers were gathered in a room. Jews from all over the world were gathered with Peter, the leader of the Apostles and the Eleven. At this time, a great wind blew and a flame appeared as a tongue of fire, which split itself into many individual flames above the heads of those present. The Holy Spirit came upon these people and each began to speak in tongues. Despite the fact that many had no common language, they were perfectly able to understand each other.

The symbols of Pentecost are the flame, the wind and the dove which represents the Holy Spirit. The color of Pentecost is red and the priest wears red vestments on this day.

BIRTHDAY CELEBRATIONS /LUNCH TIME SALES AT SCHOOL

As has always been the case we are happy to acknowledge student birthdays at school. However given the current COVID 19 restrictions we are currently not accepting birthday cakes, cupcakes or lolly bags with unwrapped lollies. Children wishing to share a birthday treat with their friends are encouraged bring in either wrapped lollipops or a small packet of chips. These can be distributed easily with minimal contact.

Also given the restrictions on adult access to the school, lunch time sales have also been suspended until further notice.

These measures are for the safety of everyone. We will review these as is appropriate as the year progresses.



Our COVIDSafe Transport Plan

Physical distancing on our public transport services

What's happening and why?

- We've got a plan to provide a COVID-safe transport network as the numbers on our network increases, and more people return to work and school.
- From Monday 18 May, green dots are being used on trains, buses, light rail and ferries to show customers the safest places to sit and stand, and encourage them to maintain 1.5 metre physical distancing on our services.
- We're also increasing messaging to encourage customers to rethink the way they commute and travel, e.g. avoiding travelling in the peak, using more active transport such as cycling and walking, and using trip planning apps to better plan their journeys with regard to capacity.
- Our number one priority remains keeping our staff and customers safe as they move across NSW.

Who does physical distancing apply to?

- Everyone must play their role in maintaining a safe physical distance when using public transport.
- NSW Health advice is that children are at lower risk. Physical distancing rules do not apply on dedicated school bus services.
- The NSW Government's policy is to not leave a school student behind. School students will be given priority over other customers on all public transport even if this means a service goes over physical distancing capacity.
- Household groups can sit together on a service.

What does the plan include and how will it help to maintain physical distancing, especially as restrictions ease?

The plan focuses on:

- **Physical distancing:** 'No dot, no spot': From Monday 18 May, green dots are being used on trains, buses, light rail and ferries to show customers the safest places to sit and stand, and encourage them to maintain 1.5 metre physical distancing on our services. 'No dot, no spot' means customers should wait for the next service or get off if physical distancing capacity has been reached. School children and people who require assistance, such as customers with disabilities will be given priority.



- **More data:** Customers are being given real time information through trip planning apps, social media and the Transport Info website to see which services have space available to maintain 1.5 metre physical distancing.
- **Avoiding peak travel:** We're encouraging customers not to travel in the peak if they don't already do so as some services are already close to maximum 1.5 metre physical distancing capacity.
- **Deep cleaning and more hand sanitisers:** Intense and ongoing cleaning will occur throughout the transport network and there will be a continued rollout of hand sanitiser at key transport hubs, including at high demand stations.
- **Boosting parking:** Special event-style parking arrangements will be in place at Moore Park for people who are able to drive to work. Other locations will be rolled out soon. In addition car park operators will be offering special deals for all-day parking.
- **More cycling and walking options:** The Government is working with councils on establishing pop-up cycleways and enhancing pedestrian access to allow more people to find alternative routes to work.
- **More services:** Full services will continue to run and we'll consider changes to increase public transport services where capacity and resources are available.

How will we manage crowds to support physical distancing?

- We're monitoring 1.5 metre physical distancing around the network in near real-time to help better manage customer flow and crowding.
- We'll consider changes to increase public transport services where capacity and resources are available.
- We'll control access to platforms, stations and interchanges to help manage physical distancing where necessary.
- In the case of buses, drivers should follow normal guidelines once they reach the new reduced capacity limits supporting 1.5 metre physical distancing. This will vary according to bus type. Physical distancing capacity stickers will be rolled out across the bus network to provide guidance on maximum capacity per bus.
- The exception to this is ensuring children and people with disabilities are prioritised and that no child is left behind. If customers choose to get off if they feel uncomfortable due to increased capacity please be patient in allowing time for them to do so.
