School Update Related to COVID-19

School Remains Open

We greatly appreciate the support and positive feedback we are receiving during this period of learning from home. As announced by the Prime Minister *'if you can work or study from home – you should do so'*. While our school is open, the vast majority of our students are already studying from home, and **we appreciate the efforts** of parents and carers as fewer students on site means fewer journeys being made by parents outside their homes. It also shows great respect for our community, our staff and those families who simply need to send their child to school due to commitments as essential workers. Given all school work (until the Easter Holidays) has now been provided or will be provided online, I am **strongly encouraging those students who can study from home** to do so.

Advising Student Absences

Please continue to advise us via the usual channels if your child will be away from school. The State Government has confirmed that students who are at home due to the Premier's advice, <u>and are attempting school work</u>, will be marked as having a 'flexible' timetable / attendance. This will <u>not</u> be counted as an absence. Students not attempting school work <u>will</u> be marked as 'absent'. Students attending school will be marked as 'present'. If parents advise that their child is sick, then that day would be marked as 'sick'.

Learning at Home

We continue to add to our online learning options to support students and families. Please supervise your child's online work and refer to the poster included in this newsletter "Using Technology Safely at Home". We know this is new learning for all of us and there may be some glitches to begin with so please be patient as we test our technology in an endeavour to strengthen the connection between home and school.

The teachers are very concerned about not only the children's learning, but also about their wellbeing. With this in mind, our classroom teachers will be making a phone call to each family this week. If your child's teacher calls you and you are not available, please do not call them back. They will call you again later in the week.

Gold, Merit and Faith in Action Awards

All awards will be put on hold until further notice given that most students are learning at home.

School Staff Working Remotely

Over the course of this week staff from OLOL will trial working remotely on one day on a rotational basis, ensuring we have staff on site each day. This is a critical step in ensuring we are able to provide staff with the ability to work remotely, identify potential issues and test our protocols and technology. Many businesses, professions and industries successfully trialled and then implemented working remotely. We are working to ensure our staff are well placed to do the same. Supervision for those students unable to stay at home will continue, however, in the light of Government direction the school will be further exploring and implementing staff working from home on a rostered system.

School Holidays

The end of term is fast approaching and the school holidays will begin. This holiday will be different to any that we have experienced before. We all have the responsibility to follow Government directives and follow the restrictions put in place to help prevent any further spread of COVID19. It is also an important time for children and staff to rest and have a "holiday" from school. As such OLOL staff will not be providing learning activities or responding to emails. If it is necessary to contact the school in this holiday period please use the school email address.

Out and About

As we approach the end of Term 1 it is a very different landscape to that with which we began the term. Who could have predicted such a dramatic change and in a similar way we cannot predict what Term 2 will look like.

Of what you can be assured is the ongoing commitment of the staff at OLOL to support each child and each family though these challenging times. We will continue to explore ways to support student learning in a society where "social distancing" is now the norm.

As part of the changing educational landscape NESA has determined that NAPLAN 2020, for all students, has been cancelled. This decision includes the cancellation of:

NAPLAN Online practice testing, 23 March – 9 April 2020 NAPLAN Online tests, 12 May – 22 May 2020 NAPLAN paper tests, 12 May – 15 May 2020.

This is a sensible decision in the current climate and relieves pressure on students who are currently learning from home.

At this point in time, as a school community, we will also have to cancel our Mothers' Day stall and our Mothers' Day Mass and Breakfast - hard decisions for hard times.

As we approach the Easter break I wish all our families a peaceful, safe and holy Easter. I look forward to the time when our classrooms and playgrounds are once again full and we are all able to gather together as a community.

Dear Staff, Parents and Children,

My first word is a Big HELLO to everyone in our beloved OLOL community. I am sure that you all have been doing the right things by staying safe and well and looking after yourselves and all around you.

I have found this to have been one of the most challenging times in my life, because I have been forced to re-arrange my life both as a private person and as a priest in lot of ways, for instance I had to livestream Weekend Masses from the Our Lady of Lourdes Facebook page, and honestly I got quite distracted in the first Mass due to the cyberspace nature of the congregation. However, it is not all bad news, since I have been able to put into practice a few things Katherine O'Meara, a poet from Madison, Wisconsin, USA wrote recently in a poem called 'And People Stayed Home'.

I am very grateful to one of our wise parishioners for sharing it with me recently, and it goes like this,

'And people stayed home, and read books and listened, and rested and exercised, and made art and played, and learned of new ways of being, and stopped and listened deeper, Someone meditated, someone prayed, someone danced, someone met their shadow, And people began to think differently and people healed and in the absence of people who lived in ignorant ways, dangerous, meaningless and heartless, Even the earth began to heal, and when the danger ended and people found each other, grieved for the dead people, and they made new choices, and dreamed of new visions, and created new ways of life, and healed the earth completely, just as they were healed themselves.'

While waiting for the day of a complete healing, I hope that you might find O'Meara's prophetic words inspiring and resourceful as I have in the last many days. It is worth remembering that you and I are not alone in these uncharted waters called Covid-19, because our Lord Jesus is always by our side and keeps affirming us 'do not be afraid', as he often said to the disciples throughout his public ministry (cf. Mt 10.31; 14.27; 28.5; 28.10; Lk 12.32).

Let this uplifting message from Jesus be the light to shine our path in coming days, and kindle the fire of love and compassion to warm our hearts and the hearts of others' around us. Please join me in our livestream liturgies for Holy Week and Easter starting with Palm Sunday this weekend by going to the Our Lady of Lourdes Parish, Seven Hills website and following the link. Before ending this letter, allow me to say thank you to our highly committed school staff for the extra effort they are putting in to make sure our children receive the best care and support when both attending school and learning at home.

Wishing you all a grace and energy-filled Holy Week and Easter. May the Risen Jesus bless you and keep everyone safe .



Dear Parents and Carers

We understand that the COVID-19 pandemic has affected the financial circumstances of many families in a sudden and unprecedented way. Our long standing principle remains that **no child who meets the enrolment criteria will be refused enrolment or disadvantaged because of a family's financial circumstances**.

In view of the current situation, it will not be possible to follow our usual process for validation of these circumstances. In good faith, we are taking the following actions:

- if your family is experiencing financial difficulties due to COVID-19, we ask that you pay what you can when you can
- we will be suspending any follow up activity with respect to outstanding fees
- we will not be sending statements for Term 2 until there is greater clarity about the duration of the pandemic
- for excursions that may have been paid for and cancelled, we will be refunding these payments irrespective of whether or not CEDP is able to obtain a refund from the excursion supplier either by crediting back to your account or reimbursement, depending upon what method was used to make the excursion payment
- in relation to excursions that are merely postponed, we will not take any action at this stage.

Thank you so much for your assistance as we continue to support not just our students in their continued learning but also our dedicated staff.

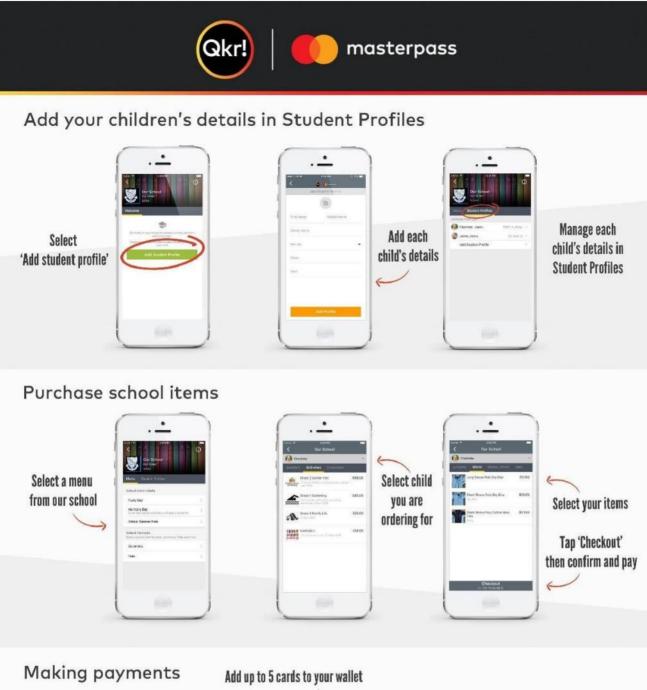

Pastoral letter to the clergy, religious and people of Parramatta during the coronavirus crisis

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

Many of us feel powerless in the face of this corona virus pandemic. We see in a devastating way how widely a virus spreads person to person and the immense damage it is doing to our community.

We are indeed living in a time of great crisis locally and globally. So, it is only human that we will experience considerable fear and anxiety.

However, as people of faith in Jesus of Nazareth, we are called to place our trust in our God who promises to be present with us even in these times of great suffering and sickness.

Even in his seeming absence, we still place our hope in the One who loves us tenderly and with great mercy. And so, as responsible citizens and faithful Catholics, in solidarity with our wonderful doctors and health professionals, our first rule must be: "Do no harm."

That means not doing anything that might spread the virus to others with whom we live in community. We need to listen to our medical experts and not to conspiracy theorists who use any crisis to profiteer or stir up hatred and division.

We must also comply with the directives of our government authorities for the sake of the common good. The gospel calls us to practice such solidarity in these difficult days.

As many of you already know I have <u>issued a statement</u> which involves the closure of churches and the curtailment of our regular worship practices until this crisis abates.

Please adhere strictly to these directives that I have given. Further updates can be found here: <u>www.parracatholic.org/covid19</u> as the situation we are in is so fast changing and complex.

All of us in the Diocese of Parramatta must follow these guidelines without exception, so that we can be like St Joseph: 'Protectors of Life'.

Becoming 'Protectors of Life' will certainly demand of us sacrifices. Let's especially not forget the suffering in our midst: the elderly, the weak, the disabled, the homeless, the unemployed et cetera. Let us not forget vulnerable groups and communities: the indigenous, the asylum seekers in detention, prisoners et cetera.

Then there are also those whom the Catholic Church through the traditional Lenten Project Compassion supports.

In previous ages before germs and viruses were understood, people blamed strangers, Jews and 'outsider's' for sickness. Anyone who was different could be the target of people's fear.

So, let us in these days be especially mindful of caring with compassion and charity for any persons in community who are on the 'margins': be they the aged, the chronically ill and all those living in poverty and isolation. Let our love for them be real and concrete.

May we also use these days to deepen our prayer and spiritual lives. Even as we mourn our losses, Pope Francis encourages us, "Let us call upon him today, firmly rooted in prayer, for without prayer all our activity risks being fruitless and our message empty." (*Evangelii Gaudium*, no. 259)

It includes online liturgy resources for personal and family prayer and various options for viewing Mass on-line and meditating on the daily scripture readings.

The coronavirus crisis strikes fear and anxiety into people across the globe. It also reveals deep cultural prejudices and divisions against the elderly, the weak and even those of certain race and ethnicity.

Our faith makes us step beyond these human boundaries. It expands our horizons and pushes the limits of our capacity to love.

Through the example of Jesus, we are called to embrace those vulnerable in our society and reach out to them. It is not the time to look after ourselves only but to care for others, through our prayers, acts of kindness and deep communion with them.

May these days of suffering and fear draw us ever close to Christ and let's all pray with Pope Francis to Mary, our mother:
