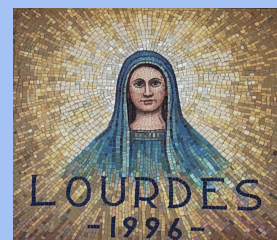

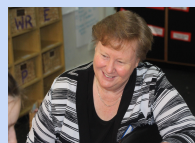

Principal's Message



Dear Families of Our Lady of Lourdes,

When I reflect back on the term it has certainly been different to any other. Throughout the term I have been astonished by the way all in the community have worked together to face the challenges head on. Ultimately, there is much for us to be grateful for and this would vary depending on your own experiences. The greatest challenge is perhaps to take the time to reflect on what we are grateful for during this term and in our lives. The Examen is an ancient practice in the Church that can help us see God's hand at work in our whole experience.

- 1. Become aware of God's presence.** Look back on the day and note the times you felt God was with you, assisting. Feel God with you now and ask to become more conscious of God's presence. It may be helpful to repeat a phrase like, "Be still and know that I am God" (Psalm 46v10), or any other prayer that connects you to a Higher Power.
- 2. Look back with gratitude.** Review the past 24 hours and notice what you're thankful for. What happened to make you feel blessed? Take a moment to give thanks to God for providing you with these blessings.
- 3. Take an honest look at your day.** Note everything that happened over the course of the past 24 hours, your interactions with others, and your emotions. We often rush through each day, not pausing to reflect. Doing a deep, honest reflection of the past day causes us to learn more about ourselves and improve our future actions.
- 4. Choose one part of the day, and pray about it.** From doing your review, you might find something God is directing you to work on, an emotion, a relationship that needs mending, an unpleasant situation. Pray for it, ask God's guidance to resolve it.
- 5. Pray for tomorrow.** Ask God to guide you tomorrow, leading you to your highest purpose. Send love and light to tomorrow, praying for wisdom and strength. Feel deep gratitude, knowing God has already answered your prayer and tomorrow is already blessed. Take some deep breaths, and know that all is well.

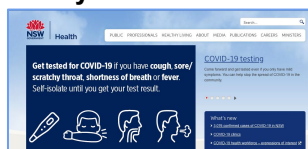
Enrolments for 2021

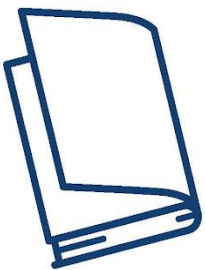
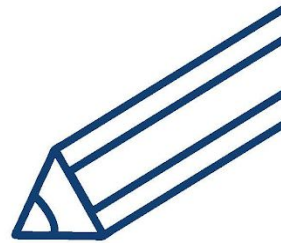

Building Child Safe Communities - Volunteer Undertaking

Dear Parents/Carers

In Catholic Education Diocese Parramatta (CEDP), we see parents and carers as partners in your child's learning journey. Parents and carers are encouraged to become involved in our schools in many important ways such as supporting classroom learning, being part of advisory groups, mentoring programs, coaching sporting teams and supporting other extra-curricular activities, canteen support and other kinds of help.

A range of checks and undertakings are required for people who work for or provide services to CEDP. These checks reduce potential risk and form part of our strategy to build child safe communities.

CEDP has launched a new *Building Child Safe Communities* form and online training module that all volunteers are required to complete by 30 September 2020.

The purpose of this training is to inform you of the standards of behaviour and other requirements that must be adhered to when volunteering for CEDP.


The undertaking should take no more than 5 minutes to complete and the training module approximately 10 minutes. Once the form and training modules are submitted, an automated email will be sent to you within two business days to confirm the status of your submission.

The undertaking form will expire within two years or when your Working With Children Check expires (if applicable), whichever is sooner. At that time you will need to complete the undertaking form and training module again. You will receive an automatic reminder email when this occurs.

Morning Kiss and Drop Afternoon Kiss and Collect

To all our parents for helping with Kiss and Drop and Kiss and Collect procedures.

Morning Kiss and Drop is running very effectively with multiple staff helping all our students to enter the school safely. Thank you to our parents in the morning for using the full amount of time between 8:10am and bell time. Cars are naturally spread out across 30-35 minutes and along with parents turning left out of the driveway this means there are no traffic delays.

Special thanks to our Year 6 students who volunteer in the morning are particularly look after our youngest students with their bags and walking them into the school grounds. These older students have been doing a fantastic job and we are very proud of them. This is one way in which these students are showing their Faith in Action.

Everyone has adapted to Kiss and Collect in the afternoon but we still need more help from parents. At the beginning of the term each family was given a time to collect your child, 2:40, 2:50 or 3:00pm. The idea of these staggered times is so that we spread the traffic out across about 30 minutes similar to the morning. Please do not queue before 2:40pm. It is actually quicker and safer if everyone tries to come in their allocated time period. We understand that it is not always possible to come in the allocated time period but your best efforts to do so are appreciated.

The Road Safety Officer from Blacktown Council, Fiona Frost, has been in contact with me and she is very impressed with all the processes that the school has put in place to try to lessen the impact traffic congestion. Critical to these processes succeeding are the staggered pick up times. Fiona has sent this message for parents.

Having spoken to your principal, I understand that the school has made great efforts to stop queuing in Grantham Road from happening by staggering finish times and managing vehicles through the school site. Now it is the turn of all the parents and carers to play their part. Please make sure that you **do not arrive** before your family's allocated pickup time as this adds to the congestion in the carpark and on Grantham Road. If you arrive early please park away from the school and wait for your pickup time. Please play your part in keeping everyone safe on our roads.
