### Principal's Message





Parents and teachers are two of the most important contributors to a student's educational success. When parents and teachers communicate well with one another, they are able to support student learning together. As such, communication between home and school is vital. I strongly encourage you to take advantage of the upcoming opportunity to engage with teachers to support your child in their learning and wellbeing.

In the past fortnight I wrote to you about the change in the reporting format for Semester 1 due to the impact of COVID19. This 2020 first Semester report at OLOL will not use the A-E scale. The report format for this semester will include a number of learning observations of what your child can do focussed on Religious Education, English and Mathematics as well as a general comment. It will also include your child's self reflection on their own learning both at home and at school. On Monday 15th June we sent parents a google form asking you to reflect on what your child was able to do well and what your child found challenging when learning at home. Your reflections will form a significant part of the conversation between you and your child's teacher.

At OLOL we strive to build our positive partnership between teachers and parents based on collaborative practices such as being approachable, mutually respectful, open and honest, sharing information and listening attentively. When we work together in this way it leads to positive outcomes where each child is supported academically, socially, emotionally and spiritually.

We look forward to speaking with parents during these upcoming two weeks to celebrate your child's achievements and to set new goals for the latter half of the year.

# Corpus Christi Sunday

Last Sunday we celebrated The Feast of Corpus Christi (The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ Sunday). It is the day in which we commemorate the presence of Christ in the Eucharist.

The Sacrament of the Eucharist is very central to our catholic faith. It is the source from which we gain spiritual strength and vitality and the summit of saving faith as we remember and receive Jesus who suffered for the entire humanity. The Eucharist strengthens our sense of unity and love. The sharing of the same bread and the same cup brings the faithful together in Jesus.

This feast reminds us that as we receive Jesus' body and blood in the Eucharist that he made the ultimate sacrifice for us. Corpus Christi Sunday allows us to focus solely on celebrating the real presence of Christ- Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity- in the bread and wine.

In the Gospel from the weekend we heard that Jesus said to the Jews: 'I am the living bread which has come down from heaven. Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I shall give is my flesh, for the life of the world.' John 6:51-58

How will you be nourished spiritually during this time of isolation? Can you be the nourishment that others may need? How can you be the Face of Christ to others and the Living Body of Christ?

# **Staffing Update**

As we continue to transition back to face to face teaching it has been necessary to make some adjustments to staffing.

As from today Mrs Leonie McKenna will be teaching Year 4W each Wednesday to replace Mrs Janet Young. Earlier this term Mrs Young needed to resign from her role for personal reasons and to enable her to spend time with her family. We thank Mrs McKenna for her support of Year 4W till the end of the year.

Beginning this Friday 19th of June we welcome the return of Mrs Elise Clynick who will be teaching Six White each Friday until the end of the year. We thank Mrs McKenna for her excellent contribution to the learning of the students in 6W each Friday during the period of home learning and in the weeks since we have returned to face to face teaching.

# **Out and About**

As is the case with all society we continue to transition back to the new normal. Our parent teacher interviews this year are a case in point.

Restrictions on adults accessing the school site means that we will not be able to meet with parents in the normal face to face setting that is our usual practice.

Instead we will have phone conferences where parents and teachers can discuss the learning progress of the students during Semester One. More than ever parent insight will be a valuable resource as parents will have a unique insight into their child's learning during the learning from home period. I strongly urge parents to book in for these phone conferences, to share information with their child's teacher and also to gain insight into the "where to next" for their child.

Traditionally at the time of the parent teacher interviews we hold our annual book fair. Currently this has been postponed until the end of the year at which time we will review the suitability of holding it or not. Should COVID restrictions prevent this from going ahead we will reschedule for 2021.

Over the last few weeks staff have been working on reviewing or developing Personalised Plans for a number of our students. These Personalised Plans document the adjustments that are made within the classroom to support student learning.

If your child has a personalised plan, a copy will be sent home for parent reference with your child's report. Parents are asked to review the plan and the goals that have been set and then return the signed acknowledgement letter to the school.

As is always the case if you have any questions about your child's personalised plan, or indeed about any aspect of your child's learning, please contact your child's teacher who will be happy to discuss this with you.

As Ms Byrnes has highlighted on the front page of the newsletter the partnership between home and school is a vital one and when it works well it is to the advantage of all stakeholders.
