## **RE NEWS**

On August 8 we celebrate the Feast of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop.

Due to COVID restrictions we are unable to celebrate a Mass or Liturgy as we would normally do. We will, however, still be celebrating a Liturgy that will be planned and recorded by the students and teachers. The students will then be able to participate in the Liturgy, as a class, at a time suitable to them throughout the day.

This term we will be introducing the St Mary of the Cross MacKillop Award. This award will be given to one child, per grade, at our weekly assembly. Each week there will be a focus on a Mary MacKillop saying and teachers will identify children who try to put the message of the saying into action. This award will temporarily replace the Faith in Action Award that we have previously had.



#### The New RE Curriculum.

In 2020 a new Draft RE Curriculum has been rolled out to schools throughout our Parramatta Diocese. The purpose of the curriculum is to empower each student to discover a meaningful and flourishing life. In responding to the signs of the times and walking in humility in the way of Jesus, the curriculum continues the universal Mission of the Catholic Church.

The new curriculum is a stage based program from Preschool to Stage 6. Each stage includes eight Learning cycles, one per term, with the exception of Preschool and Early Stage One having four Learning Cycles and Stage 6 having seven Learning Cycles.

The new curriculum appeals to "head, heart and hand", and will see students flourish. The desire is to develop a more compassionate and caring society through students being "attentive, intelligent, reasonable and responsible."

Each school in the diocese has been a part of the development of the curriculum and some schools have been able to trial the curriculum in 2019. Each school is at a different stage of implementation. At OLOL we are currently still following the Sharing Our Story curriculum whilst teachers are engaging in Professional Learning about the New Curriculum.

All our teachers will participate in a Professional Learning Program for the new Learning Framework throughout Term 3 and will be well prepared for its implementation. This is an exciting opportunity for our community to further enhance our approach to Religious Education and promises to offer great learning for our staff and students. We will undergo a process to develop new and exciting learning opportunities for all students within our school community.

#### Building Child Safe Communities - Volunteer Undertaking

#### Dear Parents/Carers

In Catholic Education Diocese Parramatta (CEDP), we see parents and carers as partners in your child's learning journey. Parents and carers are encouraged to become involved in our schools in many important ways such as supporting classroom learning, being part of advisory groups, mentoring programs, coaching sporting teams and supporting other extra-curricular activities, canteen support and other kinds of help.

A range of checks and undertakings are required for people who work for or provide services to CEDP. These checks reduce potential risk and form part of our strategy to build child safe communities.

## CEDP has launched a new *Building Child Safe Communities* form and online training module that all volunteers are required to complete by 30 September 2020.

The purpose of this training is to inform you of the standards of behaviour and other requirements that must be adhered to when volunteering for CEDP.

The undertaking should take no more than 5 minutes to complete and the training module approximately 10 minutes. Once the form and training modules are submitted, an automated email will be sent to you within two business days to confirm the status of your submission.

The undertaking form will expire within two years or when your Working With Children Check expires (if applicable), whichever is sooner. At that time you will need to complete the undertaking form and training module again. You will receive an automatic reminder email when this occurs.
