I love to share with our children my deep love of reading. I always read the Children's Book Council of Australia shortlisted books in each category every year. I also enjoy recommending books to students and teachers alike.

Leading Literacy Educators have noted that becoming a lifetime reader is based on developing a deep love of reading. If children develop a love of reading when they are young then they are more likely to do so when they get older.

For younger readers in particular, their home environment is critically important in developing a positive attitude towards reading. So what can parents do to encourage it? Here are some great ideas that parents can use to motivate their children and help them develop a love for reading.

**Reading to your son or daughter:** it's important to make sure you read to them as much as they read for themselves.

**Escapism:** promoting reading as a form of escapism from the general pressures of school and their social lives encourages children to see reading as a form of self-indulgent relaxation.

**Anything goes**: introduce your children to a wide variety of texts, comics, e-books, novels, short stories, picture books, online articles and magazines are all possibilities.

Encourage your children to read for pleasure, the opportunities books provide are endless!

## **Out and About**

On the front page of the newsletter Ms Byrnes talked about the importance of fostering a love of reading in children. As she noted there are many ways to do this. Each year, as a school. We celebrate books and encourage reading amongst our students. We do this in a number of ways: by sourcing good quality books for our library and making them accessible to all students, by organising activities such as our Book Week celebrations and normally, in a non COVID year, our annual Book Fair.

Another way we promote reading amongst our students each year is via the Premier's Reading Challenge. This year, given the impact of COVID 19 the challenge has been modified slightly. If students do not complete the challenge this year they will not be penalised for not having a continuous record of challenge completion and will still be eligible for silver, gold and platinum certificates at the appropriate time.

Students are now able to have up to 10 personal choice books (that is books not officially listed as PRC books) included in their reading log - this is an increase of 5 books as compared to previous years. Students in K - 2 are required to have read, or have read to them, 30 books. Students in Year 3 - 6 are required to read 20 books. Books read should be entered into the online log using the login details provided in Term 1.

Currently 28 students have completed the challenge whilst 94 have registered to participate. I would like to see many more students participating in the challenge and reading the quality literature that the challenge promotes.

PRC books are readily available for borrowing through the school library and via our elibrary. A reminder that the challenge finishes for students, in just over 2 weeks, on Friday August 28th.

#### **Draft New Curriculum ~ Religious Education**

Religious Education in the Diocese of Parramatta has undergone much change in the last two years. The process of developing a new approach, currently known as the Draft New Curriculum, has been a collaboration with students, parents, teachers, clergy and system leaders. This innovative and ambitious project has led to the development of Learning Cycles (one per term), that apply scripture and tradition in a meaningful way to the contemporary life of young people. This endeavour supports our students to grow in faith and understanding through prayer, reason and action in daily life.

Term 3 at OLOL marks the next step towards implementing a new curriculum that will replace 'Sharing Our Story', the current curriculum that has been in place for over 20 years. Throughout the term, teachers from all grades will be participating in professional learning days, in situ with our Mission Educator Amanda Bentley and CEDP Inquiry Learning expert Jo Kirby. These days will enable us to develop learning cycles that apply scripture and tradition in a meaningful way to the contemporary life of our young people. These professional learning opportunities for staff enable extensive theological formation and ongoing development.

This is an exciting opportunity for our faith community of Our Lady of Lourdes to further exclaim our commitment to empowering all our young people to discover a meaningful and flourishing life.

We look forward to sharing this journey with you throughout the term and will keep you updated about opportunities that will extend the learning experience further for students and their families.

**Feast of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop:** On Friday the students were able to celebrate this feast (which was on August 8) through a liturgy that was led by our Year Three children. We were able to do this by recording the children reading the prayers and also providing opportunities for each class to share their responses to one of Mary MacKillop's sayings. This proved to be a reverent and meaningful prayer experience as the students celebrated it in their learning spaces at a time that was suitable to their grade. Each class prepared their own sacred space and the students all prayed and sang hymns together in honour of Australia's first saint. Where possible we are hoping to continue to celebrate upcoming liturgies in a similar way through the use of technology. Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta is changing the way students learn about their faith in response to changing times. A bold new approach to Religious Education has been developed based on the big questions students ask about life, identity and belonging.

I can now report that our Draft New Curriculum for Years 9, 10, 11 and 12 have been approved by the New South Wales Education Standards Authority (NESA). This is a great outcome and supports the important work that is already underway with schools trialling the new approach for many of the other year groups. We are now looking forward to completing the final version of the curriculum so it can be launched in Term 2, 2021.

With a strong focus on connecting students' faith through a framework we call 'Head, Heart and Hands', the new approach is about all aspects of school and parish life here in Parramatta. We encourage everyone to learn more and there will be information about this from your school soon.

Many people have contributed to this once-in-a-generation draft curriculum particularly our Principals, teachers, Religious Education Coordinators, clergy and Catholic Education staff. Bishop Vincent's pastoral leadership has also been critical in guiding this work. It has been a very collaborative process and I particularly want to thank families who have been involved.

This is a very exciting time for our school communities. We look forward with confidence to the launch in 2021 as we 'go into the deep' together to support the faith life of our students and their families.
