

#### **Principal's Message**

Dear Families of Our Lady of Lourdes,




But this feast uses the word in a much wider sense. It refers to all those baptised Christians who lived a good life sincerely and have died and are now with God in glory. We simply do not know how many people we are talking about but it must be a very large number.

The Gospel chosen for All Saints Day gives us what we know as the Beatitudes from the beginning of the Sermon on the Mount. It is, in fact, a charter for holiness. The Beatitudes are a kind of mission statement saying what kind of person the good Christian will be. It describes the kind of society that exists when we live according to these values — a place of truth and love, of compassion and justice, of peace, freedom and sharing. The general message is that those are really blessed when they commit themselves totally to the way that Christ invites them to follow.

Last Friday and this coming Friday numerous children from Our Lady of Lourdes will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. Confirmation is one of the three sacraments of initiation. Confirmation perfects our baptism and brings us the graces of the Holy Spirit. Confirmation is a sacrament of empowerment. It gives the strength to follow Jesus and to become involved in the mission that Jesus left to the Church. That is to be true witnesses of Christ and to spread our faith in word and deed. We pray for our young people as they continue to grow in faith.

# Kindergarten Orientation continues

OLOL is running an adapted Kindergarten orientation for our newest children and families in our community. This will involve a second virtual Parent Information meeting for parents of children beginning Kindergarten in 2021 tonight. Children will attend an orientation session at OLOL in small groups of 10-12 children on Friday. We make these newest and youngest members of our community most welcome.

# Week 6 and 7 Swimming Program

OLOL is able to participate in our annual Swim and Survive Program for all year groups Kindergarten to Year 6. Our Lady of Lourdes and the Aquatic Safety Training Academy have COVID Safety plans in place. On the first day of swimming your child will be grouped according to the information you've supplied in the Swim and Survive Student Survey. Children will then be assessed by ASTA staff and re-grouped accordingly. Students will learn water safety and survival skills. **Due to**Covid restrictions parents are unable to attend the centre in 2020.

Students from Year 6 will take part in a Leadership Day looking at the concepts of servant leadership and how they can use their God given gifts and talents to serve others. This day will be held at school and facilitated by the Year 6 teachers.

**Due to COVID restrictions it is not possible to have our annual Christmas Concert.** As an alternate the children will prepare and participate in a Christmas story reflection throughout the day. This will take place in the hall and photos and videos will be shared with parents.

# **Swimming Carnival 2/12**

This year's Annual Swimming Carnival will be held on Wednesday, 2nd December at Blacktown Aquatic Centre in their indoor pool. Students from Years 3-6 will be involved in a half day carnival, starting at 9:00am and concluding at 12:00pm. Due to COVID restrictions students will be sitting in grade groups, and will have exclusive use of the indoor pool area and bathroom facilities. Photos of the event will be shared with parents. **Unfortunately due to Covid restrictions parents are unable to attend the centre in 2020.** At the conclusion of the carnival, children will return to school via bus and will be at school for the remainder of the school day.

# **Dry Land Carnival 2/12**

Students in K-2 will be participating in a 'water play day' and take part in various novelty events held at school in the playground whilst the primary carnival is occurring at the Aquatic Centre. Photos of the event will be shared with parents. This event will operate with modifications to ensure compliance with COVID safe guidelines. **Unfortunately due to Covid restrictions parents are unable to attend in 2020.** 

# **End of Year Awards Assembly 3/12**

End of of Year awards that are normally presented at the beginning of the Christmas Concert will be presented at school in the hall on 3/12 at 9:15am. This event will be recorded and shared with parents. Details are being finalised and will be communicated in the coming weeks.

# Student Reports go home 4/12

School reports will be sent home on the 4/12. The format of the school report will be the usual format for semester 2 and will report on all key learning areas using a scale of achievement, a scale for effort and a comment section has been included for Religion, English and Mathematics as well as a general comment.

#### Year 6 Graduation Activities 10/12

Details of these activities are still be finalised as we work to meet COVID safe guidelines. Nevertheless, Year 6 will celebrate their graduation with mass, a graduation ceremony where they will receive their graduation certificates in a modified format. These two events will be live streamed. We are working to clarify if any parents can attend or not. These details will be communicated as soon as possible. The Year 6 disco will be able to be held in the hall. This event in other years was supported on the night by a small parent committee. In 2020 staff only will attend. Children can be dropped and picked up from this event using our current kiss and drop and kiss and collect routines.

Children who receive commendable effort in all Key Learning Areas in their school report have in the past been invited to a Principal Morning Tea held in the hall. This event will be modified in 2020 to meet COVID safe guidelines. A Principal's Picnic will be held in the playground, with extra play time, some games and individual serves of "picnic" food.

#### **Change to Afternoon Kiss and Collect Times - Advance Notice**

To all our parents thank you for helping with Kiss and Drop and Kiss and Collect procedures.

Morning Kiss and Drop is running very effectively with multiple staff helping all our students to enter the school safely. Thank you to our parents in the morning for using the full amount of time between 8:10am and bell time. Cars are naturally spread out across 30-35 minutes and along with parents turning left out of the driveway this means there are no traffic delays. Any children later than 8:45am need to go to the office for a late note and your child's attendance will be marked as a partial absence.

Everyone has adapted to Kiss and Collect in the afternoon but we still need more help from parents. **Beginning Monday 9th November** the staggered times to collect your child will change. The staggered times will be **5 minutes later for groups 1 and 2.** This is to ensure that we can maximise learning time in the afternoon and allow time for students to return to school and make their way to the hall at the conclusion of the swimming programme.

Group 1 Yellow **do not queue before 2:45pm. The hall doors will not open prior to 2:45pm.** Remember this is still 5 minutes before the official end of the school day. It is actually quicker and safer if everyone tries to come in their allocated time period. We understand that it is not always possible to come in the allocated time period but your best efforts to do so are appreciated.

Just as respect is an expectation of the children, it is essential that parents model the same respect by being courteous in the car park at all times. This includes taking turns and being patient as you make your way to the kiss and collect zone. We ask also that parents obey the left turn only sign when exiting the driveway. This is to ensure the safety of all members of the community.

On Sunday it was All Saints Day. The saints are people who said "yes" to God's plan for them and are now in heaven. As a school we remembered and celebrated the lives of the men and women who were merciful like our Father.

Through the words of The Beatitudes, we can follow the Way of Christ. If we follow these statements we can be guided to living a life that will bring us to God's Kingdom. The word from The Beatitudes shed a light on how to know and meet God.

Here are some responses to what The Beatitudes might mean to us.

- 1. Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Be satisfied with what you have. Share the good things we have with others because God wants us to.
- 2. Blessed are they who mourn, for they will be comforted. Comfort those who are suffering. Help others feel better about themselves after a loss.
- 3. Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the land. Humility- a true sense of who you are. Get the ego out of the way.
- 4. Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be satisfied. Do what is fair for everyone. Think WWJD (What Would Jesus Do?")
- 5. **Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy.** We forgive those who are unkind to us. Look for ways to show kindness to others.
- 6. Blessed are the clean of heart, for they will see God. We do what is right just because we know it is the right thing to do.
- 7. Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God. We try to bring God's peace to the world. We control our behaviour so people can see Jesus in us.
- 8. Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. We are willing to stand up for God's laws even if we are teased or insulted.

Stage Two have been focussing on the message of The Beatitudes as they engage in the learning cycle from the New RE Draft Curriculum and address the driving question "How Am I Merciful in my Daily Life Within My Community?"

**Confirmation** is one of the seven sacraments of the church. It is also one of the three sacraments of initiation into the Catholic Church, the other two being Baptism and Holy Communion. On Friday night, students from our school joined with the parish in celebrating this sacrament. Through this, they sealed their faith by receiving the gifts of the Holy Spirit. The seven gifts are wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety and fear of the Lord. Just as Baptism gives us new life, Eucharist nourishes life, and Reconciliation restores life when it is broken, Confirmation strengthens that life by the gifts of the Holy Spirit. (cf.CCC 1285)


