Building Child Safe Communities - Volunteer Undertaking

Due to an update in the processes for volunteer undertakings all volunteers are required to complete the new Building Safe Communities form and online training. This is regardless of whether your existing declaration was less than 2 years ago. We do understand that given the restrictions of COVID19 parents are unable to volunteer at present but it is still a great opportunity to make sure your volunteer status is current. Last Term the following item was placed in the newsletter several times. I encourage you to read this and update your volunteer status if you have not already done so. As always we will continue to run Parents as Educators courses at OLOL early in 2021. If COVID19 restrictions are still in place an alternate mode of delivery will be organised.

Dear Parents/Carers

In Catholic Education Diocese Parramatta (CEDP), we see parents and carers as partners in your child's learning journey. Parents and carers are encouraged to become involved in our schools in many important ways such as supporting classroom learning, being part of advisory groups, mentoring programs, coaching sporting teams and supporting other extra-curricular activities, canteen support and other kinds of help.

A range of checks and undertakings are required for people who work for or provide services to CEDP. These checks reduce potential risk and form part of our strategy to build child safe communities.

CEDP has launched a new *Building Child Safe Communities* form and online training module that all volunteers are required to complete by 30 September 2020.

The purpose of this training is to inform you of the standards of behaviour and other requirements that must be adhered to when volunteering for CEDP.

The undertaking should take no more than 5 minutes to complete and the training module approximately 10 minutes. Once the form and training modules are submitted, an automated email will be sent to you within two business days to confirm the status of your submission.

The undertaking form will expire within two years or when your Working With Children Check expires (if applicable), whichever is sooner. At that time you will need to complete the undertaking form and training module again. You will receive an automatic reminder email when this occurs.




Tell Them From Me (TTFM) Partners in Learning Survey

We would like to thank parents (41 respondents), students (Year 4, 5 and 6) and staff for completing the *Tell Them From Me (TTFM)* Partners in Learning survey. We value all our stakeholders within our school community and greatly appreciate your feedback. The information you provided will be used to maintain our commitment to working together in partnership to further improve student learning and wellbeing at Our Lady of Lourdes Seven Hills.

Tell Them From Me

Late last term we received the reports that are generated by the data from students, parents and staff. The feedback overall has been extremely positive and I will take the opportunity to share some of the key aspects of these reports with you over a number of weeks in the school newsletter. Below is a radar chart that provides a summary of the results for the seven aspects of parent perception for Our Lady of Lourdes. The blue line is OLOL. The grey line is the TTFM norm or average. You can see from a quick glance we are above TTFM norms for all seven aspects of perception. Below is a sample of one aspect of parent perception about Our Lady of Lourdes.



Parent Survey

We asked: Do you feel welcome when you visit the school?

You said: You rated feeling welcome at school 8.3 out of 10

We say: Thank you! That is apparently a good score and you rated our school above the norm for the Diocese and within the top 4 ratings across our Diocesan schools. We will continue to try to make parents feel welcome, be approachable and provide clear communication. We know it has been especially difficult for parents in 2020.

OUR LADY OF LOURDES SEVEN HILLS

Children to Return to Term 4 in Summer Uniform

Children are required to wear full school uniform at all times including appropriate haircuts and limited jewelry. Parents' support is essential to ensure their child wears correct school uniform each day.

The following information and images provide clarity about school expectations upon the return of students to school in Term 4, 2020.

Boys hair is to be kept neat and tidy, off the collar, of consistent natural colour, of gradual even grade and all extremes of fashion are to be avoided. Some examples of "styles" that are unacceptable include: ridges, lines, undercuts, steps, bowl cuts, any excessive shaping with gel, and any shaving cuts. The school reserves the right to make rulings on the acceptability of any student hairstyles.

Girls hair is to be of consistent natural colour. Hair that is longer than shoulder length is to be tied back from the face. Hair is to be off the face and out of the eyes. Ribbons, hair slides etc, if worn should be in the uniform fabric or blue. Scrunchies are sold from the Uniform Shop. No nail polish is to be worn to school.

Out and About

With the continued positive COVID 19 case numbers in NSW we have seen some easing on restrictions of what we can and can't do in the school environment. Hence, as Ms Byrnes mentioned on the front page, we are now able to have a modified Kindergarten orientation along COVID safe guidelines.

In a similar way we are exploring what may be possible in terms of our Year 6 graduation and disco. Once again any celebration would need to be conducted following COVID safe guidelines. We are mindful that Year 6 have been unable to participate in many of the normal activities that are part of their last year of primary school and want to ensure that this milestone is marked in some way.

In a normal year the Year 6 students and parents would have engaged in a number of fundraising activities to help cover the cost of the graduation and disco. This has not been possible this year. The OLOL Parent Group has kindly offered the proceeds of lunchtime iceblock sales to be given to Year 6 to help cover the graduation expenses. This is greatly appreciated.

Last Friday we recommenced, iceblock sales, with Year 6 students and a teacher selling the iceblocks to the students. These sales were very popular and while it provided a source of funds for our Year 6 graduation it also provided a treat for our students which they have missed for the majority of the year. Judging by the lines outside of the Creative Arts room and the brisk business that we did it was a popular decision all round.

We will continue to sell iceblocks on Monday, Wednesday and Friday at lunch time for the remainder of the term. We have also had a donation of Messy Monkeys so we will sell these as well. For both the iceblocks and the Messy Monkeys the cost is \$1.

In coming weeks we will outline, based on Health Department advice, what we believe will be possible to celebrate our Year 6 students completing their final year at Our Lady of Lourdes.

BOOK WEEK CELEBRATIONS THIS FRIDAY

We will hold our postponed Book Week celebrations this Friday, October 23rd. The theme this year is "Curious Creatures, Wild Minds". Students are encouraged to come dressed as their favourite book character or perhaps as a curious creature. We will have 2 parades, one for our K- 2 students and another for our 3 - 6 students with a special Readers Theatre performance at both parades. Each class will have a special Book Week activity in their classroom and the book that OLOL voted as their favourite will also be announced. So come along dressed up ready for some fun!!



On Monday, October 19, all staff participated in professional learning based around the New RE Curriculum. This was facilitated by our Mission Educator Amanda Bentley and Teacher Educator of Contemporary Learning Jo Kirby. We were able to explore the meaning of HOPE and make the connections with the curriculum - as it presents a theology of hope for our young people. The purpose of the curriculum is to empower each young person to discover a meaningful and flourishing life- historical and transcendent.


As we explored the concept of HOPE, we unpacked the Beatitudes, which Pope Francis describes as a message of hope for all humanity and also reflected on ways that we can be an instrument of hope at school and for our families. We then spent the rest of the day focussing on instructional strategies to advance student learning. All teachers collaborated to harness high-yield strategies to teach the learning cycle from the New Draft RE Curriculum.

As has been previously communicated, Stage 2 and 3 are implementing the New RE Curriculum this term. The learning cycle for Stage 2 is "How am I Merciful in my Daily Life?" where they will learn about the importance of forgiveness and justice for human flourishing.

So far this term they have started to explore the questions

- What does Mercy look/sound/feel like?
- Why is Mercy important in my community?
- Why did Jesus want us to know about Mercy and forgiveness?

The essential content focuses on Jesus' teachings on forgiveness and mercy. There will be a focus on sacred scriptures relating to the sacraments of Penance and Reconciliation and how this brings us closer to God. The students will reflect on and explore the role of forgiveness and mercy in their daily life. Below is an example of some of the brainstorming of the knowledge that the Year 3 children shared with their class on mercy. This was an introductory activity that will be reviewed as an assessment to show the new knowledge gained throughout the term.



Stage 3 are learning about the relationship between prayer and Christian discipleship. They have started to explore the questions:

- · What is prayer and Why do we pray?
- · When do you use formal and informal prayers in your own life?
- · Why are there formal and informal prayers?
- · How do informal/formal prayers help you in your life?

2021 school travel applications are now open



Applications for student travel in 2021 opened on Monday 12 October 2020.

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass for 2021 can now <u>apply</u> online. A new application should be submitted if a student is applying for a school travel pass for the first time or requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who have changed school/campus, changed address, repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should <u>re-apply or update their details</u>.

Where there is a change of distance eligibility based on a student's grade, the system will automatically update a student's entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new eligibility criteria, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

Applications need to be submitted before **31 December 2020** to ensure that current student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card remains valid. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2020, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2021.



Student Data Validation forms will be sent to primary household contacts via email or SMS next week by CEDP can you please ensure that you complete these forms to ensure we have accurate and reliable information.

Dear Parents and Carers

Thank you for your interest in the faith and learning of children and young people in the Diocese of Parramatta. I am writing to advise that an updated version of the Draft New Curriculum for Religious Education is now available on the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta website.

When it is launched in late 2021 the Draft New Curriculum will replace 'Sharing Our Story', the current curriculum that has been in place for more than 20 years. For several years now, our Catholic community has been working together to update the way we share our faith with children and young people. This is a work in progress and will take time.

The Draft New Curriculum remains faithful to Sacred Scripture and Tradition while ensuring that the way that the learning and teaching happens is kept up-to-date. We've been surveying our schools about their experiences of trialling aspects of the Draft New Curriculum. As you would expect, we're continuing to make changes based on feedback from clergy, parents, teachers and students.

As a result, you'll notice that this document now includes references to the relevant sections of the Catechism of the Catholic Church and a new 'insights' section for teachers to use as a resource and guide. A guide to Understanding the Draft New Curriculum for Religious Education in the Diocese of Parramatta has also been provided on the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta website to help community members learn more.

We know that it is important to keep our Catholic community updated about this approach that is all about sharing our Catholic faith with the next generation. If you would like to share your thoughts, please contact feedback@parra.catholic.edu.au.


