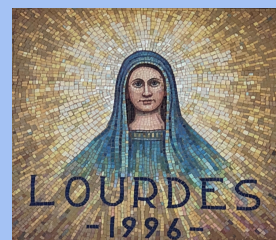

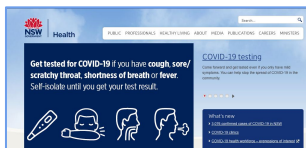

Term 1, 2021 OLOL School Events and Parent Access and Participation

LOL wishes to update you about some routines and scheduled events for the remainder of this term, especially in light of the recent easing of restrictions with the latest advice from NSW Health and Catholic Education, Diocese of Parramatta. **Our Lady of Lourdes can welcome parents back in a COVID-safe way.**

Please note the following:

NSW Services App and QR code

All parents visiting the school site for meetings, volunteering or school events will be required to sign in using the NSW Services App and QR code. These QR codes will be located in the school office, on the school gates and various locations in the school.

Student Entry to School

Parents and carers are asked to continue to physically distance from one another and from staff during school pick-up and drop-off.

Morning Procedures

- Enter via Kiss and Drop - encourage independence of your child to open their own car door and exit the car with their bag.
- Park outside the school grounds and walk your child to the school gate. (For safety reasons no parking in the car park)
- Parents may enter the school grounds with their child but must sign in using the NSW Services QR code. Parents must exit grounds **before** the second bell so that the site can be secured and lessons can begin punctually at **8:40am**

Student Exit from School

Parents and carers are asked to continue to physically distance from one another and from staff during school pick-up and drop-off.

Afternoon Procedures

Park and collect

- 2:50pm normal dismissal time. (We encourage parents to stagger their time of arrival between 2:50 and 3:00pm. Supervision concludes at 3:20pm)
- NO kiss and collect
- Park either in the car park or in surrounding streets
- Students will assemble in the Covered Outdoor Learning Area
- Parents to walk in the main gate and follow the keep left signs as you move towards the Covered Outdoor Learning Area
- Parents please continue to bring your name tag so that children can be called quickly to meet you
- Exit via the main gate
- Parents are still required to maintain social distancing at all times.

Grantham Road Bus and Walkers

- Same process where a teacher will walk children to the Grantham Road Gate

OOSH

- Same process where children will gather and go to OOSH from within the school grounds

Olive Street

- Same process where a teacher will walk children to the Olive Street gate to catch the bus

Thank you for working with us to establish parents being able to enter the grounds particularly to collect children.

Appointments with Teachers

Parents can meet with teachers face to face on the school site. Please make an appointment via the school email or contacting the school office to arrange a mutually agreeable time. Enter via the school office and sign in with the kiosk and the NSW services QR code.

Parent Volunteers and Parents as Educators Course

Parents wishing to volunteer in educational support roles are to complete the online learning module and volunteer undertaking. Face to Face parents as Educators course in 2021 will be postponed. Please see the next page for further details.

When volunteering, enter via the school office and sign in with the kiosk and the NSW services QR code.

Excursions/Incursions

All future excursions and incursions will go ahead unless health advice changes. Requests for parent volunteers will be communicated near to the time of the excursion.

When volunteering enter via the school office sign in with the kiosk and the NSW services QR code.

Ice Block Sales

Parent volunteers are needed for ice block sales. When volunteering, enter via the school office and sign in with the kiosk and the NSW services QR code.

Monday Assembly Week 9 - 22 March, 2021

Monday assembly will take place and be recorded and made available to parents. No assembly in Week 10. The hall capacity does not allow for parents to be present. This will be reviewed on a regular basis.

Project Compassion Day -19 March, 2021

This event will take place weather permitting. As in previous years this is a student learning activity only.

OLOL Cross Country -26 March, 2021

This event will take place weather permitting. Given that this is an outdoor event parents are welcome to attend. All parents will be required to use the QR code to sign in. We will now be using the NSW services QR code for all visits to the school. Parents need to adhere to physical distancing requirements of 1.5m, use hand sanitiser upon entry and remain in designated spectator area which will be located at the edge of the playground where there are numerous silver seats available. Parents are encouraged to bring a folding chair, water and hat.

Holy Week Liturgies 29th March - 1st April, 2021

The children will participate in liturgy each day during Holy Week. This will be recorded and shared with parents. The hall capacity does not allow for parents to be present. This will be reviewed on a regular basis for future liturgies.

Hot Cross Bun Meal deal - 1 April, 2021

Parent Volunteers needed. Contact Pat Fiorenza if you can assist. When volunteering, enter via the school office and sign in with the kiosk and the NSW services QR code.

Health Information

Please continue to take a cautious approach to COVID-19. If you or your child have any of the symptoms of COVID-19, please get tested and provide the negative test result to the school before returning.

Much consideration has taken place relating to these decisions. It takes time to transition and to continue to adjust processes while still meeting any health requirements. Thank you for your understanding and continued support with this matter.

Building Child Safe Communities - Volunteer Undertaking

With the easing of restrictions parents will be able to volunteer in educational support roles on site. To expedite opportunities for parents to volunteer, **in 2021 only**, attending the Parents as Educators course will not be compulsory. **However, it is a legal requirement that as a minimum any volunteer must complete the Building Child Safe Communities form and online training module.** Please find the relevant information below.

In Catholic Education Diocese Parramatta (CEDP), we see parents and carers as partners in your child's learning journey. Parents and carers are encouraged to become involved in our schools in many important ways such as supporting classroom learning, being part of advisory groups, mentoring programs, coaching sporting teams and supporting other extra-curricular activities, canteen support and other kinds of help.

A range of checks and undertakings are required for people who work for or provide services to CEDP. These checks reduce potential risk and form part of our strategy to build child safe communities.

CEDP has launched a new *Building Child Safe Communities* form and online training module that all volunteers are required to complete.

The purpose of this training is to inform you of the standards of behaviour and other requirements that must be adhered to when volunteering for CEDP.


The undertaking should take no more than 5 minutes to complete and the training module approximately 10 minutes. Once the form and training modules are submitted, an automated email will be sent to you within two business days to confirm the status of your submission.

The undertaking form will expire within two years or when your Working With Children Check expires (if applicable), whichever is sooner. At that time you will need to complete the undertaking form and training module again. You will receive an automatic reminder email when this occurs.

Out and About

NAPLAN ONLINE

Commencing on the 11th of May this year all students in Years 3, 5, 7 & 9 in NSW schools will complete NAPLAN Online. Last year in 2020 NAPLAN did not occur due to COVID19. In 2019 students experienced the online version of NAPLAN for the first time. This will continue again this year.

Next week our Year 3 and Year 5 students will participate in an online practice test so that they have experience of the online test under test conditions.

NAPLAN Online – Information for parents and carers

What is NAPLAN

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) assesses the literacy and numeracy skills of students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9.

Students participate in NAPLAN tests in reading, writing, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

NAPLAN provides an understanding of how individual students are performing at the time of the tests. The tests are just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process – it does not replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance.

NAPLAN also provides schools and education authorities with information about how education programs are working and whether young Australians are achieving important educational outcomes in literacy and numeracy.

Moving to NAPLAN Online

Schools in all states and territories are moving from paper tests to online tests. It is expected that all NSW schools will transition to NAPLAN Online by 2022. The move to NAPLAN Online brings new benefits for teachers and students.

What are the benefits of NAPLAN Online?

More precise results with an adaptive design: Tailored tests adapt to a student's performance and ask questions that match the student's achievement levels.

Better engagement: Research into online assessment indicates that students engage well with online tests as the questions are tailored to their achievement levels.

Tailored testing

Tailored testing provides a more precise assessment of students' performance. Students at each year level start with a similar set of questions. Depending on the number of questions they answered correctly, the next set of questions may be more, or less, difficult.

A student's NAPLAN result is based on both the number and difficulty of questions the student answers correctly. A student who completes a more difficult set of questions is more likely to achieve a higher score.

Supporting your child

The best approach for preparing your child for NAPLAN is to encourage your child to do the best they can on the day.

Excessive preparation or the use of coaching providers is not recommended.

Students can use the public demonstration site to familiarise themselves with the tools and type of questions they will experience in NAPLAN Online – <https://www.nap.edu.au/online-assessment/public-demonstration-site>

Students' digital skills

The digital skills required to complete NAPLAN Online are skills that students use in everyday classroom activities.

Students do not need to be able to touch type to complete the test. The online test is not about keyboard skills (just as the paper test is not about handwriting skills).

Withdrawals and exemptions

You can withdraw your child from NAPLAN tests.

A student may be granted a formal exemption if they have:

- a disability that severely limits their capacity to participate in the tests, or
- recently arrived in Australia and have a non-English speaking background.

Contact your child's school for further information and to complete the parent/carer consent form.

Practice tests

NSW schools participating in NAPLAN Online will participate in practice tests between 22 March and 1 April 2021.

The practice test is a trial-run and key preparation activity for NAPLAN Online in May. It is not an assessment of student ability.

Participation in the practice tests is highly beneficial as it allows schools and students to become familiar with the online assessment platform tools and processes.

NAPLAN Online 2021 test window

Practice test window: 22 March – 1 April

NAPLAN Online test window: 11 – 21 May

The assessment window for NAPLAN Online is nine days instead of the three days provided for the paper test. This is to give schools flexibility in scheduling and accommodate schools that may have fewer devices.

What if my child was absent on the day of a scheduled test?

Where possible, schools may arrange catch-up tests for individual students who were absent on the day of a scheduled NAPLAN Online test.

Catch-up tests are not permitted after Friday 21 May 2021.

COVID-19 advice

Parents should keep students at home if they are experiencing flu-like symptoms and monitor NSW Health advice on COVID-19 case locations across the state. For more information, visit

Your child's school will be required to conduct NAPLAN testing in accordance with the latest NSW Government COVID-19 advice.

Year 3 writing test

The Year 3 writing test is conducted on paper at schools participating in NAPLAN Online. All other Year 3 NAPLAN tests will be online tests.

Privacy

NESA is responsible for the collection of personal information from NSW schools to be used during NAPLAN testing and reporting.

All data collection for NAPLAN is managed in accordance with NSW and Federal privacy legislation described in NESA's privacy management plan, which can be found on the NESA website:

Results

Parents receive two reports showing their child's achievements in NAPLAN; the individual student report (ISR) and additional student report (ASR). The ISR and ASR should always be interpreted with care. Teachers will have the best insight into a child's educational progress.

Reports are usually dispatched to schools towards the end of Term 3. Schools then distribute the reports to parents.
