

Week 8

Christmas Concert - cancelled

OLOL is unable to hold our annual Christmas Concert.

Week 9

End of Year Awards 30/11

End of of Year awards that are normally presented at the beginning of the Christmas Concert will be presented at school in a modified COVID Safe format. Weather permitting this will take place at 9:00am in the main grass playground. The school is now able to assemble as a whole school provided the assembly is held outside and the children sit in their Year groups. If we are unable to hold this event outdoors, awards will be presented one Year group at a time in their own learning spaces. This event will be recorded and shared with parents.

Christmas Story Reflection 2/12

Due to COVID restrictions it is not possible to have our annual Christmas Concert. As an alternate the children will prepare and participate in a Christmas story reflection throughout the day.

Swimming Carnival- cancelled

OLOL is unable to participate in our annual Swimming Carnival for Year 3 - Year 6 in 2021. Reimbursement of costs for parents has been calculated and will appear as a credit in your school fee statement.

Year 6 Graduation Activities 9/12

Details of these activities have been finalised as we work to meet current COVID safe guidelines. Please note these guidelines are subject to change at short notice. Nevertheless, Year 6 will celebrate their graduation with liturgy, a graduation ceremony where they will receive their graduation certificates in a modified format. These two events will be live streamed.

RENEWS ADVENT



The liturgical season of Advent marks the time of spiritual preparation by the faithful before Christmas. Advent begins on the Sunday closest to the Feast of St. Andrew the Apostle (Nov. 30). It spans four Sundays and four weeks of preparation to Christmas.

A good way to help us in our Advent preparation has been the use of the Advent wreath. The wreath is a circle, which has no beginning or end: So we call to mind how our lives, here and now, participate in the eternity of Gods plan of salvation and how we hope to share eternal life in the Kingdom of Heaven. The wreath is made of evergreen branches, because Christ came to give us new life through His passion, death, and resurrection. Three candles are purple, symbolising penance, preparation, and sacrifice; the pink candle symbolises the same but highlights the third Sunday of Advent, Gaudete Sunday, when we rejoice because our preparation is now half-way finished.

The progressive lighting of the candles symbolises the expectation and hope surrounding our Lord's first coming into the world and the anticipation of his second coming to judge the living and the dead.

It is a good idea as a family to have an Advent wreath, light it at dinner time, and say the special prayers. This tradition will help each family keep its focus on the true meaning of Christmas.

1st Sunday of Advent - Lk 21:25-28. 34-36

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Your redemption is near at hand.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'There will be signs in the sun and moon and stars; on earth nations in agony, bewildered by the clamour of the ocean and its waves; men dying of fear as they await what menaces the world, for the powers of heaven will be shaken. And then they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory. When these things begin to take place, stand erect, hold your heads high, because your liberation is near at hand.

Dear Parents

In 2022 the teaching staff will administer the Mathematics Assessment Interview with all our students. This numeracy assessment identifies individual students' and whole grades' Mathematical knowledge and understanding and involves a teacher asking a series of problems within counting, place value, addition and subtraction, and multiplication and division. This valuable, comprehensive assessment has been our practice for many years.

The one on one (teacher and student) Mathematics Assessment Interview takes approximately 30-40 minutes to administer. Administering this during learning time can be a complex situation. As a result, to get a start on the administration of these tests, all staff will begin testing on the <u>first two days</u> of 2022 (Staff Development Days). We are seeking parents' help by offering to bring their child(ren) to school on Friday 28th January or Monday 31st January 2022 for approximately 30-40 minutes. These assessments will take place with the child's grade teacher or learning support teacher in their 2022 learning spaces. The more students we assess the better. It is also an opportunity for your child to get to know their new teacher. If your child is attending OOSH on these days testing can still occur as the staff will collect and return your child to OOSH. After entering your child's name in the site, write OOSH. This will let the administering teacher know to collect your child from the OOSH carers.

We will be using the school interviews website to make bookings online as we did for the half yearly Parent/Teacher interviews. We recommend that families with 2 or more children make their bookings early so that all of your children can be interviewed at the same time.

You will need to select your child's grade for 2022. Choose a suitable time with any of the available teachers listed, as all teachers on that list will be working with children in that grade.

On the reverse of this note you will find the information required to make these bookings online. Bookings will open on 8th November, 2021 and close 6th January 2022. We ask that parents log on and make appointments as soon as possible so teachers can organise and finalise timetables.

Please note, all students will be assessed during the first five weeks of Term 1 but the more interviews conducted on these two days the less interruptions to class learning in Term One. This information will be analysed and utilised by class teachers in the teaching and learning of Mathematics.

How do I access Compass?

Compass is accessible on any modern web browser (Internet Explorer, Firefox, Chrome, Safari) or by using the Compass iOS or Android apps (continue reading to learn more about the app including how to use it).

To access the parent portal, you can go to https://schools.compass.education/ where you can search for our school's direct URL.

Compass Apps








The Compass home screen

 Allows you to access other Compass and school resources. The Tools icon allows you to update your contact details and change your password.

 Custom notifications for items that require your action or attention. These may include excursion notifications, ordering options for school photos, absence notifications, survey, and student report availability.

Entering an Attendance Note

- From the Compass home screen (or from your student's profile), click the Add Attendance Note item.
- 2. From the pop-up window:
- Select the reason
- Enter a brief description of the absence
- Select the start and finish time
- Click the 'Save' button



Where possible, attendance notes should be entered prior to the absence/lateness occurring.





SMS Link

If your child is marked as absent without prior approval you will receive a message containing a link. When you follow the link, you will have the opportunity to explain the absence.

The link will expire after you have clicked it, meaning that it cannot be used to explain unapproved absences in the future. Instead, you will receive another message containing a new link, allowing you to repeat the process.



 From the home screen, click on the 'View Academic Reports' item or navigate to the 'Student Profile' and click the 'Reports' tab.

Privacy and Security

When you use Compass you will notice a padlock appears in your browser's address bar on the left.


UNIFORM ORDERS
