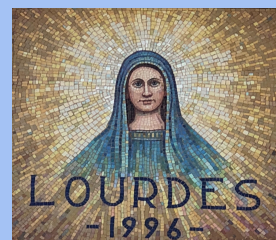

COVID- Smart Measures for OLOL

The safety of students and staff remains the top priority for our school community. Please continue to be vigilant and follow 7 day isolation rules for students who test positive or who are household contacts.

Watch for Symptoms	<p>If your child is unwell, even with mild symptoms you must keep them home and get them tested. If they display any symptoms they should take a PCR test (nose and throat swab) or rapid antigen test (RAT).</p> <p>If symptoms continue your child should not come to school, even if they get a negative rapid antigen test result. Your child may return when they get a negative PCR test result and have no symptoms.</p> <p>If a child is unwell at school parents will be contacted to promptly collect their child.</p>
Vaccinations	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• All staff on school sites must be fully vaccinated.• We strongly encourage all students and their families to get vaccinated. Children aged 5 to 11 can now get vaccinated. Parents are encouraged to book their child in for a vaccination at the first available opportunity.• Once eligible, all adults are encouraged to get booster shots.
COVID19 Positive Cases	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• If your child has no symptoms and there is a positive case in their class, year or other grouping, they can continue to attend school in line with NSW Health advice.• Staff and students who get a positive rapid antigen test result must register it on service.nsw.gov.au or the Service NSW app as soon as possible.• Staff and students who receive a positive rapid antigen or PCR test result must tell their school as soon as possible, and follow NSW Health advice.• Students who are a household contact must also isolate for 7 days.• OLOL will regularly communicate to parents about the presence and impact of COVID-19 in our community.• In order to do this parents are asked to let the school know of positive cases. This information is kept confidential.
Essential Hygiene	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Our Lady of Lourdes is regularly and professionally cleaned including additional cleaning targeting high touch areas• Bubblers are turned off and unavailable. Therefore, send your child with a labelled water bottle.• Continue to implement appropriate social distancing. Encourage good hygiene practices including washing hands frequently.

St Vincent de Paul Flood Appeal

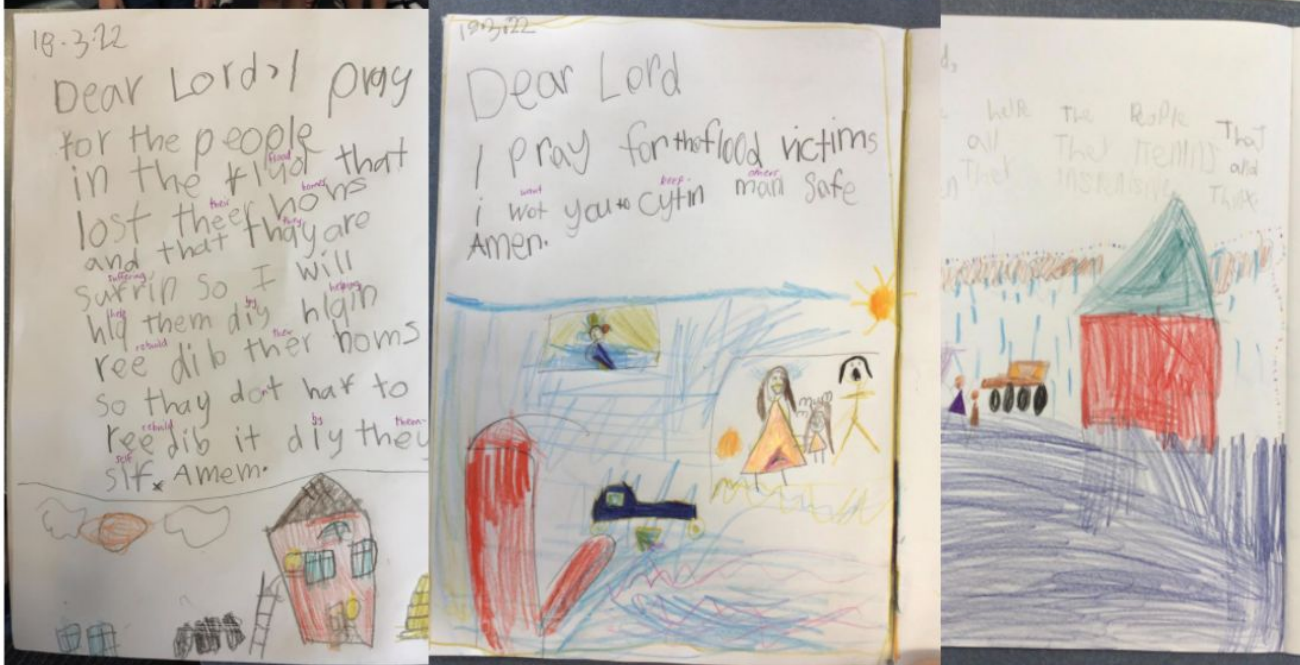
On Friday the 18th March, Our Lady of Lourdes had a mufti day and raised money to support those affected by the recent floods.

DANCE FEVER AT OUR LADY OF LOURDES

Dear Parents,

Once again Our Lady of Lourdes has the opportunity to participate in an exciting program known as 'Dance Fever.' Dance Fever is where the students learn a variety of dances, which includes Jive, Tango, Waltz, Cha Cha, Foxtrot and Samba where they learn to dance as a 'couple.' Students are also taught progressive dances, where they change partners and dance with 'everyone.' Apart from having fun, students also develop listening skills, co-ordination, social skills, self esteem, confidence and fitness. Due to the positive feedback and enjoyment expressed by our students for this program it will once again be offered throughout Term Two 2022.

Payment for the program is covered from the excursion levy that each family paid with their school fees. The program will run once a week over ten weeks, on Wednesday, with students from Kindergarten to Year Six involved in 40 minute lessons.

What the program looks like.

Kindergarten –Year Two - students learn a series of dances, including Rock n roll, Foxtrot and party and progressive dances. Hip Hop routines have also been added to the junior program which challenges children beyond partner dances. Each lesson is designed so that students in this age group learn about rhythm and body movements.

Year Three-Year Six - students learn two dance routines in Latin and Ballroom, including Cha Cha, Foxtrot, and an African Ceremonial routine. A big part of our program also teaches students Funk and Hip Hop routines and a series of party and progressive dances. The two structured Latin and Ballroom dances taught during the term are then performed at the Dance Fever Interschool Challenge.

At the end of each school term Dance Fever hosts the "***Dance Fever Interschool Challenge***". This is a spectacular event where children from schools participating in the program utilise the skills they have learnt through a professional production, totally organised by Dance Fever. Students compete from grades Three to Six at Homebush Sports Centre. This showcase event is for the entire school community to thoroughly enjoy. Due to Covid Restrictions the date and time for this event is still pending and will be updated next term.

We are very fortunate to be able to offer this program at Our Lady of Lourdes once again this year and we are certain that our students will enjoy the opportunity to have fun through dance.

 - Guidelines for administration

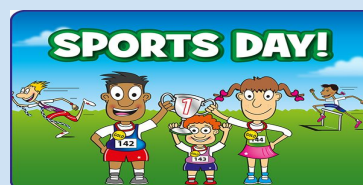


Uniforms

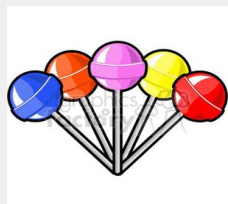

The due date for Term 1 fees is 16th March, 2022.

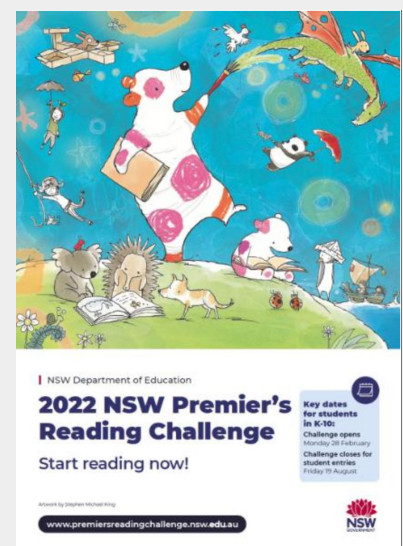

Premier's Reading Challenge

Each year as a school community we participate in the Premier's Reading Challenge. This challenge encourages students to read, or have read to them, quality books during the challenge period. Students who successfully read the agreed number of books receive a challenge certificate at the end of the year. Students who successfully complete the challenge for 4 successive years receive a gold certificate, students who complete the challenge for 7 consecutive years receive a platinum certificate. Each student receives an individual log in to register the books they have read. These are registered online at the Premier's Reading Challenge website. The school then validates these records in order for the student to receive their certificate.

The challenge officially commenced on Monday, February 28th and concludes on Friday August 19th. Logon details for all students including our Kindergarten students were sent home in Week 8.

How do I access Compass?

Compass is accessible on any modern web browser (Internet Explorer, Firefox, Chrome, Safari) or by using the Compass iOS or Android apps (continue reading to learn more about the app including how to use it).

To access the parent portal, you can go to <https://schools.compass.education/> where you can search for our school's direct URL.

Compass Apps

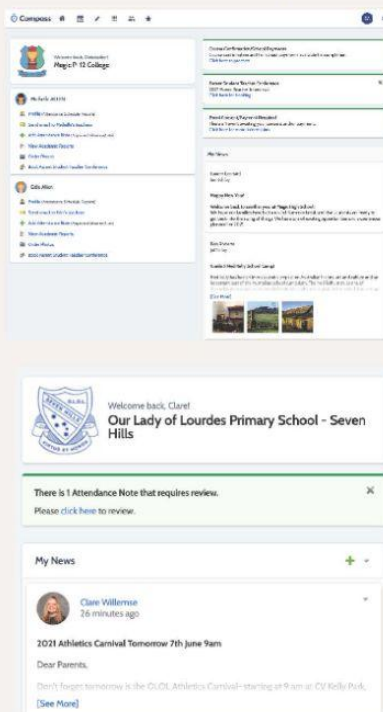
Using the app you can:

- View the school news feed
- Receive messages from the school
- View your child's timetable and the school calendar
- View Learning Tasks
- Add Attendance Notes
- View academic reports



The Compass home screen

The home screen provides you with relevant alerts and news, as well as quick access to your child's profile.



School Calendar

- Link to school events

Your Children

- To access more information click on the relevant quick link or select Profile to access detailed information about your child.

Main Menu

- Allows you to access other Compass and school resources. The Tools icon allows you to update your contact details and change your password.

News

- Recent school news items and information relevant to you. This may include newsletters, details of upcoming events.

Alerts

- Custom notifications for items that require your action or attention. These may include excursion notifications, ordering options for school photos, absence notifications, survey, and student report availability.

Entering an Attendance Note

1. From the Compass home screen (or from your student's profile), click the Add Attendance Note item.

2. From the pop-up window:
- Select the reason
 - Enter a brief description of the absence
 - Select the start and finish time
 - Click the 'Save' button

Where possible, attendance notes should be entered prior to the absence/lateness occurring.

What is an Attendance Note?
An Attendance Note is used to explain when your child is absent or late for school.



SMS Link

If your child is marked as absent without prior approval you will receive a message containing a link. When you follow the link, you will have the opportunity to explain the absence.

The link will expire after you have clicked it, meaning that it cannot be used to explain unapproved absences in the future. Instead, you will receive another message containing a new link, allowing you to repeat the process.

Viewing Academic Reports

1. From the home screen, click on the 'View Academic Reports' item or navigate to the 'Student Profile' and click the 'Reports' tab.

2. A list of 'Academic Reports' will be displayed. Click the report title to download the PDF.

School Uniform

The official day for changing to winter uniform is Monday, 9th May (Week 3 Term 2). From this day, each child will be expected to wear their full winter uniform. However, should the weather be cool before that date, children can wear their winter uniform to school. Children must wear either their full summer uniform or their full winter uniform during this time. **Please ensure that you purchase your child's winter uniform before this date.**

Children are required to wear full school uniform at all times including appropriate haircuts and limited jewelry. Parents' support is essential to ensure their child wears correct school uniform each day.

The following information and images provide clarity about school expectations upon the return of students to school in winter uniform in Term 2, 2022.

Boys hair is to be kept neat and tidy, off the collar, of consistent natural colour, of gradual even grade and all extremes of fashion are to be avoided. Some examples of "styles" that are unacceptable include: ridges, lines, undercuts, steps, bowl cuts, any excessive shaping with gel, and any shaving cuts. The school reserves the right to make rulings on the acceptability of any student hairstyles.

Girls hair is to be of consistent natural colour. Hair that is longer than shoulder length is to be tied back from the face. Hair is to be off the face and out of the eyes. Ribbons, hair slides etc, if worn should be in the uniform fabric or blue.
