

Principal's Message



Dear Families of Our Lady of Lourdes,

This Friday numerous children from OLOL will be receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation at our OLOL Parish Church.

Confirmation is the meeting point on which God strengthens you with his Holy Spirit for your service in the Kingdom of God.

The word confirmation comes from the Latin "firmare", meaning "to strengthen". The Holy Spirit strengthens you in faith. He helps you to know God, and to do the right thing. He gives you the ability to remain true to your faith and tell others about it. For that you need his help. If you listen to him, the Holy Spirit is like an inner navigation system that shows you the way through your life.

During the celebration of Confirmation the bishop, or the bishop's delegate, extends his hands over those to be confirmed and calls upon God: "Send your Holy Spirit upon them to be their helper and guide."

Then each person to be confirmed is anointed with chrism on the forehead as the celebrant says, "Be sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit."

We pray for our young people as they continue to grow in faith.

Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful.

And kindle in them the fire of your love.

Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created.

And you will renew the face of the earth.




Enrolments for 2023

The school is accepting applications for enrolment. Enrolment applications are available online on the school website or collection at the School Office.






How to update your child's profile on the QKR APP.


Step 1 .. choose Our lady of Lourdes as your location.

STANDARD 3: FAMILIES AND COMMUNITIES ARE INFORMED AND INVOLVED

AIM: Organisations support children by actively engaging with families and communities

WHY IS THIS STANDARD IMPORTANT?

Parents/Carers have primary responsibility for raising their children.

Children feel more valued when child safe organisations include families and community in decisions affecting them, and when organisations are accountable for their child safe practices.



What should CEDP be doing?

- Families have the primary responsibility for the upbringing and development of their child and are provided opportunities to participate in decisions affecting the child.
- The organisation engages in open, two-way communication with families and communities about its child safety approach, and relevant information is accessible.
- Families and communities have a say in the organisation's policies and practices.
- Families and communities are informed about the organisation's operations and governance.

- Promotes and participates in various resources and initiatives for parents, carers and communities which support a child safe culture.

NAPLAN

Last week our Stage 2 & 3 teachers have guided our Year 3 & 5 students through NAPLAN assessments. Catch up tests for those students who missed tests last week, are being held this week. Whilst important, please keep in mind that these tests are simply a snippet of one moment in time. It is vital that we all understand that our students work hard all year round and that their capabilities and achievements are certainly not limited to one set of tests!

Tell Them From Me Survey

Shortly our teachers, students in Years 4, 5 and 6 and parents, will have the opportunity to take part in a survey called Tell Them From Me (TTFM). This survey is being administered in every school in our diocese. The information you provide will be used to maintain our commitment to working together in partnership to further improve student learning and wellbeing at Our Lady of Lourdes Primary School. UPDATED COVID SAFE GUIDELINES FOR SCHOOLS

Over the last few weeks NSW Health has made some changes in relation to close/household contacts of positive COVID-19 cases. Please read the revised protocols carefully. Please be advised that any student who is unwell should not attend school to ensure the safety and well being of all community members.

Watch for Symptoms

If your child is unwell, even with mild symptoms you must keep them home and get them tested. If they display any symptoms they should take a PCR test (nose and throat swab) or rapid antigen test (RAT).

If a child is unwell at school parents will be contacted to promptly collect their child.

COVID19 Positive Cases

- If your child has no symptoms and there is a positive case in their class, year or other grouping, they can continue to attend school in line with NSW Health advice.
- Staff and students who get a positive rapid antigen test result must register it on service.nsw.gov.au or the Service NSW app as soon as possible.
- Staff and students who receive a positive rapid antigen or PCR test result must tell their school as soon as possible, and follow NSW Health advice.
- There are no changes to the isolation requirements of confirmed cases, who must isolate at home for 7 days.
- Students, who are a household contact of a positive case, no longer have to isolate if they are not symptomatic, however they must follow the following protocols when attending school:
 - notify the school that they are a household contact of a positive case
 - conduct a daily rapid antigen (RAT) and return a negative result each morning before attending school for 7 days
 - it is recommended, for primary school students, that they wear a mask
 - must not attend any overnight excursions, including school camps
 - must not attend specialist centres or support classes
- People who have had COVID-19 in the last 12 weeks do not have to comply with the above guidelines should they become a close contact
- OLOL will regularly communicate to parents about the presence and impact of COVID-19 in our community.
- In order to do this parents are asked to let the school know of positive cases. This information is kept confidential.

Rapid Antigen Tests (RAT)

- To assist with COVID-19 screening additional rapid antigen tests were recently distributed to parents to be used for symptomatic testing or for daily testing as part of requirements for close contacts returning to school.

Vaccination

- All staff on school sites must be fully vaccinated.
- We strongly encourage all students and their families to get vaccinated. Children aged 5 to 11 can now get vaccinated. Parents are encouraged to book their child in for a vaccination at the first available opportunity.
- Once eligible, all adults are encouraged to get booster shots.

In the coming weeks we will be inviting our students, teachers and parents to provide feedback on their experience of our school using an online survey. The surveys are an important part of our whole school evaluation and planning process.

From **Monday, 30 May to Friday, 1 July**, we invite you to complete the *Tell Them From Me (TTFM) Partners in Learning* survey. As we value the role of parents and carers within our school community we would greatly appreciate your feedback. The information you provide will be used to maintain our commitment to working together in partnership to further improve student learning and wellbeing at *Our Lady of Lourdes*.

The survey is anonymous and will take approximately 20 minutes to complete. You are able to access the parent survey (20 different languages available) on your computer or mobile device by using the link that will be provided to you in the weeks ahead.

Parents received a note explaining the participation of students in this survey last Monday.

Attendance

With the impact of COVID19 we know that there has inevitably been a significant impact on student attendance. We understand that children have been absent for periods of time if they have tested positive or if members of the family have tested positive. We also appreciate that parents have followed health advice and kept children at home if displaying cold or flu like symptoms.

Nevertheless, as we continue to return to a much more normalised pattern of schooling it is more important than ever that children have a high rate of attendance. School attendance plays a critical role in enhancing the lives of children and young people. COVID19 certainly taught us that every day of attendance adds to a student's opportunity to learn, develop and experience success in education.

The aim is for every student to have an attendance rate of 90% or higher. To support the wellbeing of students we will be reviewing student attendance over the coming weeks and months. If we identify a concern we will communicate with the family either by phone or letter and do our best to support you and your child to have a great attendance rate.

DRESS CODE – We suggest that children wear attire that they feel most comfortable in and relevant to this special occasion. Please be mindful of footwear. **No shoes with polish or shoes that may scuff or damage the floor are permitted on the dance floor.**

CATERING – Please note that if the children require food or drinks, they will need to bring it with them, as they will not be able to leave their school area to go to parents at any time. Security guards will also not allow any commercially prepared food to be brought into the venue. **Adults are NOT permitted to bring any alcohol inside the venue.**

SECURITY - Once children are in the Arena, they are not allowed outside or upstairs and must remain in their allocated school area. All children must be collected from the Main Arena area by a parent or authorised person. Children will not be allowed to leave the Arena to meet parents outside the venue.





- Providing a request by parents and written instructions from a medical practitioner for medication that is not obtained on prescription, indicating:
 - Name of student
 - Condition for which the medication is required
 - Guidelines for administration

Seesaw for K-4 at OLOL Seven Hills.

What is Seesaw?

Seesaw is an app that is a platform for student engagement. Teachers can empower students to create, reflect, share, and collaborate. Students “show what they know” using photos, videos, drawings, text, PDFs, and links. It’s simple to get student work in one place and share with families, and nothing is shared without teacher approval.

Families can log in to the Seesaw Family App to see their child’s work and like and comment.

Over the course of this term K-4 classes will start to use Seesaw as a way to share their work with their teachers and parents as well as complete activities. When your child’s class is ready to go you will receive information and a QR code to log into the Seesaw family app to see your child’s work.

Seesaw:

- Makes your child’s thinking and learning visible so we can see and celebrate their growth over time
- Opens communication between home and school, so we can share ideas to best support your child’s learning at home and at school
- Gives your child an authentic audience for their work -- you! -- which motivates them to do their best

Connect to your child’s learning on the Seesaw Family app.

Parents need to download the Seesaw Family App and sign in to their family account using the Family QR code sent home to be able to see and like and comment on your child’s work and see posts from the teachers. Compass Parent Portal

A guide for Parents



How do I access Compass?

Compass is accessible on any modern web browser (Internet Explorer, Firefox, Chrome, Safari) or by using the Compass iOS or Android apps (continue reading to learn more about the app including how to use it).

To access the parent portal, you can go to <https://schools.compass.education/> where you can search for our school's direct URL.

Compass Apps


Using the app you can:

- View the school news feed
- Receive messages from the school
- View your child's timetable and the school calendar
- View Learning Tasks
- Add Attendance Notes
- View academic reports



The Compass home screen

The home screen provides you with relevant alerts and news, as well as quick access to your child's profile.



School Calendar

- Link to school events

Your Children

- To access more information click on the relevant quick link or select Profile to access detailed information about your child.

Main Menu

- Allows you to access other Compass and school resources. The Tools icon allows you to update your contact details and change your password.

News

- Recent school news items and information relevant to you. This may include newsletters, details of upcoming events.

Alerts


- Custom notifications for items that require your action or attention. These may include excursion notifications, ordering options for school photos, absence notifications, survey, and student report availability.

Entering an Attendance Note

1. From the Compass home screen (or from your student's profile), click the Add Attendance Note item.
2. From the pop-up window:
 - Select the reason
 - Enter a brief description of the absence
 - Select the start and finish time
 - Click the 'Save' button



Where possible, attendance notes should be entered prior to the absence/lateness occurring.




SMS Link

If your child is marked as absent without prior approval you will receive a message containing a link. When you follow the link, you will have the opportunity to explain the absence.

The link will expire after you have clicked it, meaning that it cannot be used to explain unapproved absences in the future. Instead, you will receive another message containing a new link, allowing you to repeat the process.

Viewing Academic Reports

1. From the home screen, click on the 'View Academic Reports' item or navigate to the 'Student Profile' and click the 'Reports' tab.
2. A list of 'Academic Reports' will be displayed. Click the report title to download the PDF.



Privacy and Security



When you use Compass you will notice a padlock appears in your browser's address bar on the left.

This is because Compass uses a technology called TLS (Transport Layer Security). This means that your Compass session is encrypted and secure. Further, Compass adheres to PCI DSS compliance obligations to ensure any credit card details are managed safely, consistent with industry credit card regulations.

We are committed to the privacy of your information.






