

# **LOURDES OOSH**

As parents would be aware at the beginning of Term 1, 2023, Lourdes OOSH will cease operating as a community based Out of Hours School Care service and will become "Ambrose School Aged Care" operated by the Catholic Diocese of Parramatta Services Limited (CDPSL).

This sees the end of many years of service by Lourdes Out of School Care Inc an organisation, set up and run by a parent committee, in response to the perceived need of onsite out of hours care for students at Our Lady of Lourdes, Seven Hills.

Lourdes OOSH commenced operation in 1996. Initially in a facility provided by the Parish in what is now the Creative Arts room. In 2011, with increasing demand for the service, it moved to its current home under the administration area of the school. This move required extensive refurbishment which was funded by both the OOSH organisation and the school. Further refurbishment of the Creative Arts room to allow for joint use by both Lourdes OOSH and the school was carried out later, funded by the OOSH organisation.

Lourdes OOSH provided both before school care and after school care as well as vacation care for the students of Our Lady of Lourdes. Over the years many parents gave up their time to be committee members to oversee the running of the service. Without them generously giving of their time the service would not have been able to operate. Over the years the service has been run by trained staff overseen by a manager responsible for the day to day running of the service. In many cases ex students of the school have worked as OOSH carers while studying at university.

The school and Lourdes OOSH have always worked closely together with open lines of communication. Lourdes OOSH have always been supportive of the school community - working together to upgrade facilities to benefit both the organisation and the school.

Over the years Lourdes OOSH has grown and evolved to meet the changing needs of the community and the changing demands of the sector. It has provided parents with a safe and convenient facility for their children, when work demands have meant that they needed care outside of school hours. It has provided fun and varied activities for students before and after the school day.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all those who have contributed to Lourdes OOSH over its many years of operation, both the staff, and the parents who have worked tirelessly on the committee. I would also like to thank the outgoing committee for their generous donation to the school which allowed for the purchase of our outdoor furniture and seating in the COLA area as well as some repairs to the brick wall near the basketball court.

I look forward to working with Ambrose School Aged Care as they continue to provide quality before and after school care for our students.

Thank you to the team of many teachers who have worked with the children to prepare both the awards and the concert itself. It was a most joyous celebration.



#### Children to Return to 2023 in Summer Uniform

Children are required to wear full school uniform at all times including appropriate haircuts and limited jewelry.

# Parents' support is essential to ensure their child wears correct school uniform and adheres to the appropriate grooming including haircuts and limited jewelry.

The following information and images provide clarity about school expectations upon the return of students to school in Term 1, 2023.

Boys hair is to be kept neat and tidy, off the collar, of consistent natural colour, of gradual even grade and all extremes of fashion are to be avoided. Some examples of "styles" that are unacceptable include: ridges, lines, undercuts, steps, bowl cuts, any excessive shaping with gel, and any shaving cuts. The school reserves the right to make rulings on the acceptability of any student hairstyles.

Girls hair is to be of consistent natural colour. Hair that is longer than shoulder length is to be tied back from the face. Hair is to be off the face and out of the eyes. Ribbons, hair slides etc, if worn should be in the uniform fabric or blue. No nail polish is to be worn to school.

### 3rd Sunday of Advent - Lk 3:10-18

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

What, then, must we do?



When all the people asked John, 'What must we do?' he answered, 'If anyone has two tunics he must share with the man who has none, and the one with something to eat must do the same.' There were tax collectors too who came for baptism, and these said to him, 'Master, what must we do?' He said to them, 'Exact no more than your rate.' Some soldiers asked him in their turn, 'What about us? What must we do?' He said to them, 'No intimidation! No extortion! Be content with your pay!'

A feeling of expectancy had grown among the people, who were beginning to think that John might be the Christ, so John declared before them all, 'I baptise you with water, but someone is coming, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to undo the strap of his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fan is in his hand to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his barn; but the chaff he will burn in a fire that will never go out.' As well as this, there were many other things he said to exhort the people and to announce the Good News to them.

# 4th Sunday of Advent - Lk 1:39-45

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Why should it happen that I am honoured with a visit from the mother of my Lord?

Mary set out and went as quickly as she could to a town in the hill country of Judah. She went into Zechariah's house and greeted Elizabeth. Now as soon as Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leapt in her womb and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. She gave a loud cry and said, 'Of all women you are the most blessed, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. Why should I be honoured with a visit from the mother of my Lord? For the moment your greeting reached my ears, the child in my womb leapt for joy. Yes, blessed is she who believed that the promise made her by the Lord would be fulfilled.'





Even though people are surrounded by department store decorations, commercials, Christmas carols, special foods, and the like, we believe that the Christmas celebration actually evolved from the humble story of a young woman giving birth in the straw in a stable.

What do you think went through Joseph's mind as he witnessed Mary giving birth to a baby? What do you think went through Mary's mind as she struggled with the birth experience?

The Christmas story is full of symbols. Jesus, who becomes our bread and wine – our nourishment – is laid in a manger, the feeding trough for the animals. Jesus, who is the champion of poor people, is born into a homeless family. Poor shepherds were the first to welcome the Messiah that the Jewish people had been awaiting for generations. The symbol of angels singing and praising God was a good clue that something out of the ordinary was happening.

Modern Christmas stories use different symbols to make the same points: Rudolph, the 'poorest' reindeer, becomes the champion; and Frosty, a snowman, transforms children's lives.

What story from your own personal Christmas experiences has special meaning or symbolism? Share these with your families on Christmas day.










## The Compass home screen

#### **SMS Link**


If your child is marked as absent without prior approval you will receive a message containing a link. When you follow the link, you will have the opportunity to explain the absence.

The link will expire after you have clicked it, meaning that it cannot be used to explain unapproved absences in the future. Instead, you will receive another message containing a new link, allowing you to repeat the process.


## **UNIFORM ORDERS**
